Plutarch says: "The circle which touches and separates the two hemispheres, and which on account of the division has received the name of ligation, is called Anubis. It is represented under the form of a dog because this animal watches during the day and during the night."

Out of this idea it seems there arose two mythical personages—Mercury, or Hermes, and Cerbera, the three-headed dog, supposed to guard the gates of hell.

But there were humbings even in those days, and they humbugged the dog worshippers even as Christians often humbug Christians today. Perhaps the fruit of deception was practiced on a certain nation in Ethiopia, which is said to have been bamboozled into actually setting up a dog for its king.

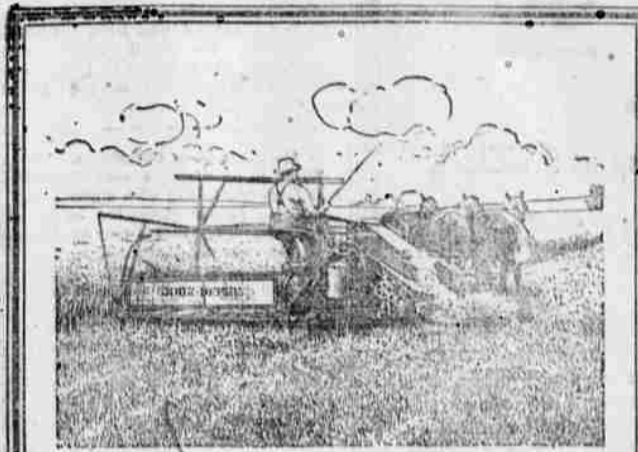
