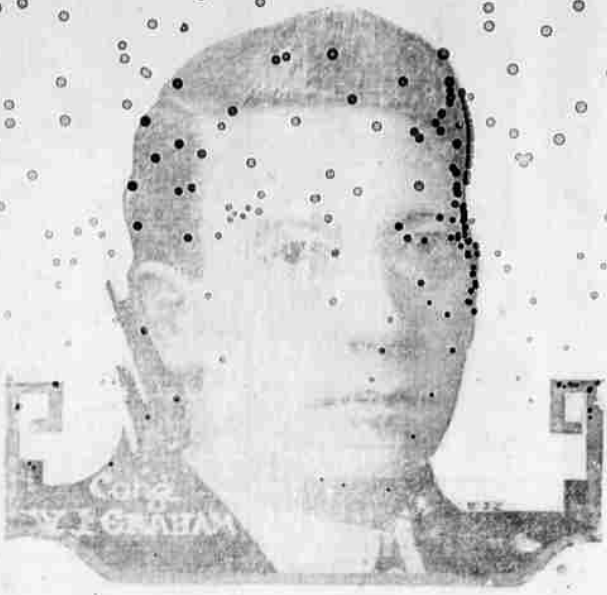

BELIEVES IN ARTESIAN WELLS

To the Editor of the Observer: Dear Sir:—I have just been reading last Wednesday and Thursday's issue of the Observer. I wish to say that I have drilled 112 wells in Union County in the past 32 years. Twenty-two of these wells flow over the top.

The flowing wells are located all around the valley, proving to me that there is an artesian basin. The other wells are road pumps. No effort has been made to get any quantity of water, except the one six inch artesian well which Mr. Miller and myself drilled for the O. W. R. & N. Company.

The artesian well was drilled 1000 feet deep and at a depth of 520 feet a stream was found which flowed 225 gallons per minute. A system of pipes placed on the well showed a pressure of 12 1/2 pounds per square inch, sufficient to raise the water 37 feet above the surface. Through bad management the railroad company broke the gate valve closed and locked on the well with

ARTESIAN WATER TO GO IN THE VALLEY TO DRILL FOR IT WHERE THE ARTESIAN BASIN HAS BEEN PROVED.

My advise is put down a twelve inch well right in La Grande and force the water direct into the big water main on Second Street. Then when people open their faucets they will get water direct from the well and when they don't open a faucet the pump would be pushing good pure water into the city reservoir.

I firmly believe that two 12 inch wells at a cost of ten or twelve thousand dollars each will furnish La Grande more good, clear, pure water than she ever tasted.

If there is one doubting Thomas about the quality of water underlying La Grande tell him to go to my home at the corner of Spring and Walnut Streets and fill up on water that contains no chlorine, algae or too salts.
