DENVER IS AT THE FOREIGN TRADE

Special Efforts Being Made to Place Factory Outputs With South American Consumers.

DENVER, Aug. 5.—Denver exporters are rapidly building up the sales of commercial South American by giving greater attention to the needs of Latin American countries by more sympathetic reference to their customs and peculiarities before the export, by more careful packing and by refraining from buying the South American merchandise to pay their bills.

Lessons derived from the experience of Denver manufacturers may be a benefit to those of the country. Business circulars are being issued in Spanish and correspondents familiar with that language are being employed so as to approach the customer in his own language.

Realizing that much of their merchandise must be transported by rail over the Andean passes, the Denver men are limiting the volume of packages of machinery to about 250 pounds and are packing them in cases composed of heavy planks reinforced with steel bands.

Extension of credit is being encouraged through the assistance of certain New York banks.

Denver exporters feel that it is best not to introduce quotations with inflated surcharges.

There is scarcely a South American country with which some Denver manufacturer has not established commercial relations. The Andean mines of the west are reached by way of the west coast and State America are the best customers for the class of machinery which Denver has to offer.

One local exporter of mining machinery reports that he has received more inquiries from Latin America in the past six months than ever
