ACTION ON COLOMBIAN TREATY IS DEFERRED

(By Associated Press to The Observer) WASHINGTON, Aug. 8.—Discovery of a decree by the president of Colombia declaring the petroleum lands of Colombia are "the property of the nation," resulted in postponing approval of the Colombian treaty by the senate foreign relations committee. Vast American oil holdings there would be threatened with confiscation.

INQUIRY INTO THE MEXICAN PYRAMIDS

MEXICO CITY, July 18.—Archaeological investigations by a governmental commission to solve the mystery of who built the great pyramids at San Juan Teotihuacan, 27 miles from Mexico City, have brought to light two great granite heads of the ancient Mexican god of the air, Quetzalcoatl. These heads are almost perfect specimens, bearing all the symbolic markings.

The long disputed point as to who erected the pyramids is, as yet, unsolved. These huge mounds, one to the sun and the other to the moon, the former being 761 by 721 feet at the base and 216 feet high, are generally attributed to a tribe that preceded the Toltecs, probably dating from about the sixth century.
