NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS OF FOURTH STREET.

City of La Grande, Oregon, adopted August 6, 1919, any legal owner of property on or adjacent to Fourth street, from the south line of O and by virtue of a resolution of the avenue to the north line of C.

avenue in La Grande, Ore., whose property has been re-assessed for the payment of the improvement of said Fourth street, in re-assessment District No. 54, and whose assessment has not been paid, will be permitted to make payment of such assessment in ten equal annual installments, with interest thereon in accordance with the Charter, commencing from the date when the first installment would have been payable if application had been made under the original notice of re-assessment, by making the application and payment as hereinafter stated. Application must be made in writing, signed by the legal owner of the property, and filed with the City Recorder within ten days from the 10th day of August, 1919, the day of first publication of this notice. The application must state therein that the applicant is the legal owner of the property and give the description thereof; that he waives all defects both jurisdictional and otherwise in the proceedings levying such assessments and will pay such assessment if allowed to pay in installments and make such application under the above resolution and the applicant shall also, at the time of filing such application, pay to the City Treasurer all installments that would have been made under the original notice of re-assessment and also interest thereon to the time of the last of such installments would have been payable.

TO PROSECUTE PROFITEERS

I cannot promise a prosecution in every case, but I do promise a thorough investigation of any charge made. The department of justice will use every legal means available to put an end to the activities of those unlawfully engaged in manipulating the excessive price now prevailing with reference to foodstuffs.

In his formal announcement to the public, Mr. Hoover says:

The food control act, originally passed as a war measure and to provide for the national security and health, approved August 19, 1917, is still in force.

Section 5 of that act provides among other things:

That any person who shall willfully hoard any necessities shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not exceeding \$5000 or imprisoned for not more than two years, or may be punished by both such fine and imprisonment.

Hoarding is defined:

The act further provides: That necessities shall be deemed to be included within the meaning of the act when they are held, contracted for or arranged for by any manufacturer, wholesaler, retailer or other dealer in quantities in excess of the reasonable requirements of his business for use or sale by him for a reasonable time or seasonally required to furnish necessities produced in quantities produced reasonably throughout the period of war or no production, or withheld, whether by possession or under contract or arrangement, from the market by any person for the purpose of unlawfully increasing or diminishing the price.

What the "reasonable requirements" of a business are, what a
