In one, and it so, now. This joint committee wrestled with the problem with evident success. They made a report outlining a complete plan and program for the union of the two bodies. This report was formally approved by the board of directors of the Oregon State Retailers' Association and that action was duly announced to the convention of the Oregon Retail Merchants' Association.

Under the plan of the joint committee both organizations retain their separate identity until the Astoria convention in February, 1920, which the members of both will join and perfect the one state association.

The only change of significance in the annual election of the Oregon Retail Merchants' Association as the retirement of Leo R. Merrick as secretary, F. A. Rosenkrans, of Canby, being elected in his place, this result being due to Mr. Merrick's open opposition to the consolidation movement. Similar reasons were responsible for the convention changing its official organ from the Oregon Retailers' Journal, published by Mr. Merrick to the Oregon Merchants' Magazine, which is already the official organ of the other state association.

Velocity of Stars.

From the spectroscopic measurements made at Mt. Wilson observatory stars (i. e. the speed with which they are approaching or receding from our solar system), it appears that the star A. G. Berlin has a radial velocity of 359 kilometers a second, the highest constant velocity so far observed for any star. Next to this comes Lohman, with a velocity of 325 kilometers a second, in the opposite direction.
