STATE INSTITUTION MUST CLOSE FOR LACK OF BUSINESS.

Farmers Fail to Take Advantage of the Lime so Long Sought for.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, CORVALLIS, Aug. 9.—The state lime plant at Gold Hill will be closed down not later than September 15 unless more orders are placed. This is the announcement of Dr. A. B. Cordley, secretary, although the board of an organization has taken no definite action.

The Oregon Agricultural Experiment station recommends that several farmers get together and place a trial order to learn the effects of liming the soil. More than half of

the hundreds of farmers who say that beneficial results have been obtained through the use of lime by only one trial can the value be determined. Lack of storage capacity makes it necessary that at least 30 tons of ground limestone be sold from the plant every day.

KHAKI UNIVERSITY OPENS.

The War Department's new educational and vocational training plans were initiated in all branches at Camp Lewis by order of the Commanding General. These are the plans which convert the cantonments into military universities. Enlisted men may take, at their own option, not to exceed three hours a day for five days a week, any of the 22 educational subjects, or any of the 120 vocational subjects. Their military duties are arranged so as to permit them time for these studies.

Under the vocational training plan it is not necessary for a man to serve

in the certain branch he selects for his study. He may be enlisted in a line unit, and volunteer for mechanical training. These plans especially appeal to the young man who desires to learn a trade and earn his own way at the same time; to improve himself mentally, morally and physically; to qualify during his enlistment period for higher education or more lucrative employment after his return to civil life.

Reports that pay of enlisted men will revert after the peace proclamation to the pre-war scale are incorrect. A telegram from the Adjutant General of the Army announces that the increase awarded by the act of May 18, 1917, continues in effect from and after the approval of the appropriation act of 1920.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, CORVALLIS, Aug. 9.—Eleven representatives of the Oregon Agricultural college at the Presidio have been given special mention by camp commanders for their efficiency in military work. The college was represented by 42 men, the largest delegation from any institution in the Northwest. More military honors are said to have been heaped upon the O. A. C. men than on those from any other institution. They have not only excelled in military efficiency and were given high offices, but they ranked first in ability to shoot.
