PRISONERS BREAK JAIL YESTERDAY

The bloodhounds were put on the trail, but Sheriff Warrick who usually always handles them, was away and they did not work very well for the others. The sheriff retained about seven o'clock and took the dogs out once more. They called the man to the Al Ray residence below the hill and there several people maintained that they had seen the man make his way down the alley past the house. The dogs were taken to the alley but could find nothing to work on there. Again at eleven o'clock the dogs were taken out again and followed the scent to the Ray house. There they found the scent beneath a window and leading away up the street and the sheriff believes that the man was hidden in the house at the time the dogs first led him to it. Not knowing that the family were away and accepting the assurance of the people who had gathered that the man had gone down the alley, he did not make a search. Mr. Ray, who is a conductor, was out on his run and the rest of the family were not at home.

Hounds Follow Scent

From the Ray home the dogs led the sheriff down M. avenue to First street and then down First to near the railway tracks, where they turned west and entered the field near the hospital. They headed for the hospital first and then back to the railway track and up the track toward Perry. A freight train which left town is believed by the sheriff to have carried his man out of immediate danger of capture and he has accordingly wired all along the line for men to watch for him.

Packard is said to be about eighty-eight years of age and about five feet five or six inches tall, of rather stocky build. His weight is estimated at 125 pounds. He has heavy dark brown hair, grey eyes and a medium complexion, which has become rather whitened during his stay in jail. He claimed to be a teamster by occupation.

Largest and Smallest Engines

A young Jeweler of Hillsboro, N. D., has made a tiny engine, run by compressed air, which is only three-quarters of an inch long and weighs only 2 1/2 grains. The diameter of the cylinder bore is 28-1000 of an inch, the diameter of the flywheel is 9-64 of an inch and its stroke is 36-1000 of an inch. Contrasted with this is a valve used by the Ontario Power company of Niagara Falls, which is 31 feet high, weighs 65 tons, and has a water-opening 9 feet across, so that an automobile full of men can stand in it.
