Police Powers for Watchman.
A communication was received from the O. W. R. & N. Company asking the city to vest in the company's watchman at the Fir street crossing authority to arrest any person or persons attempting to cross the track at any time when there was danger that they might be struck by an approaching train. The matter was referred to the city manager for action with a recommendation that he make a suggestion to the company regarding the blocking of the crossing by their switch engines for unreasonable periods.

Another matter in connection with the railway was the renewal of a lease covering the right of way of the city's sewers under the railway tracks.

Changes in City Building.
Plans for the proposed alterations and improvements in the city building were submitted to the board for their consideration and the manager was instructed to get costs based on them. The alterations would include providing a detention home for women who run up against the law. The manager was also instructed to find out the cost of repainting the building.

Repairing of the Second street viaduct in the extent of putting on a new floor was discussed again and also referred to the city manager with instructions to get figures as to the cost of the work proposed.

The city manager's report, presented at the meeting, is printed elsewhere in this issue.
