TOWNS TAKING WALLOWA ELK

STATE CAN'T AFFORD TO KEEP BIG HERD OF ANIMALS.

Wallowa, Joseph and Enterprise Getting 100 Head and Forty Head May Be Turned Loose.

Returning from Wallowa county where he had gone a few days ago in company with State Game Warden Carl B. Rosenkrantz and Commissioner Marion Jack, of Pendleton, to look over the large herd of elk which the government has been keeping in the national forest, John Walden, district game warden, stated to the Observer yesterday that there is a fine chance for the people of La Grande to get a few pair of elk, or more if they want them, if they will simply undertake to move them over from Wallowa county and provide a home for them here. The government will feed them.

Of the one hundred and forty head of elk which have been ranging the forests of Wallowa county, the towns of Joseph and Enterprise have taken forty head, which they keep at Wallowa Lake, and the town of Wallowa has taken sixty head, which will be given a new home on Bear Creek. The stock men of the county and the citizens of the town named will bear the expense of moving the animals, except a few head for them, and the government will bear the cost of their keep. There are forty head which are thus unloaded and which the state game commission may decide to turn loose to the wild world.

The government has kept the elk in Wallowa county for the past seven years, but the last year or two the matter of providing sustenance for them has become more serious. This year the dry season has made the situation acute. All the woods and other natural forage was exhausted from the range where they ran and the government was forced to buy at a high price and feed them about forty miles to the feed bins. The stockmen of Wallowa county who are taking most of the elk will get the benefit of the range which has otherwise been reserved for the elk.

The state game commission, according to Mr. Walden, are in favor of turning the balance of the herd loose to run wild again, and gradually increase in numbers. This will be the case unless the government can buy more land to range on. It has been heard that these extra animals be slaughtered this fall, but their meat placed on the market at a price just sufficient to cover the cost of shipping them out to La Grande or wherever they may be sold. Mr. Walden is of the opinion that if the animals are turned loose

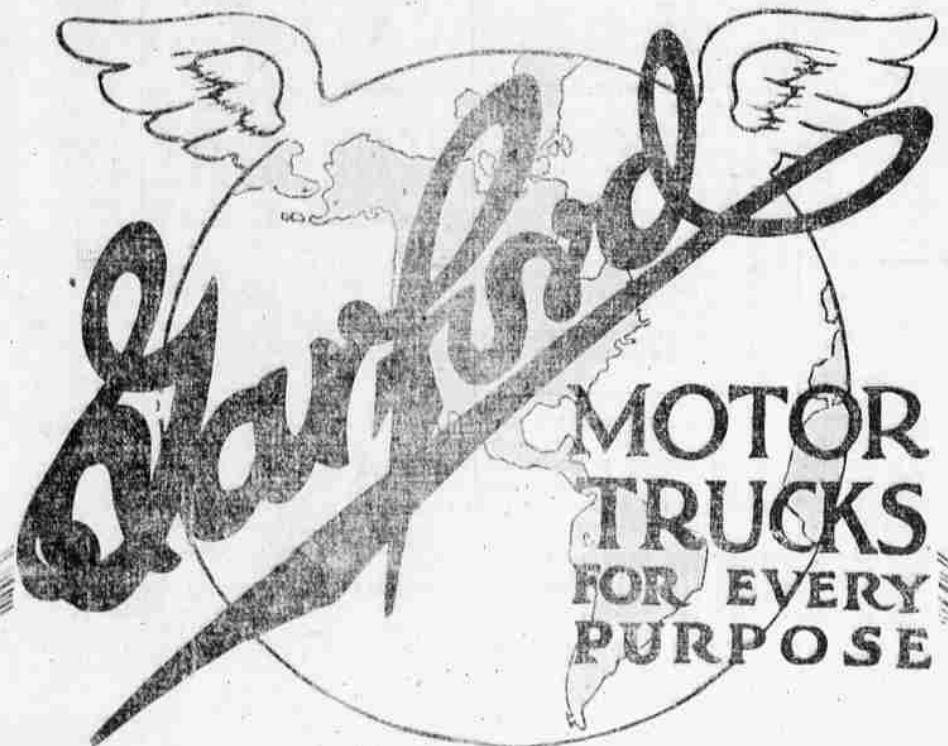
