### TRUCK DEMONSTRATION IS BEING CONDUCTED

Bohnenkamp Will to Show Anyone How Farm Hauling Can be Done

A demonstration which is being watched with considerable interest by the farmers nearby is being conducted by W. H. Bohnenkamp Co. Knowing that the greatest transportation problem of the farmer at this time is in handling bulk grain at harvest time they have found a means of adapting the Oldsmobile light trucks to this service.

A great deal has been said about the use of trucks on the farm and it is generally conceded that for all around use a light truck is best adapted to farm use. The only objection to this equipment is that at harvest time a big truck would probably be better for hauling in the wheat. Up to a few days ago even dealers in light trucks would more or less concede this point. After a few tests with the Olds, however, Chas. Bohnenkamp, who has been handling the demonstration won't even concede this point. In every test to which it was subjected the truck made a splendid showing. Absolutely no difficulty was

encountered in taking heavy loads out of the soft plowed fields and they were quickly taken to the elevator and dumped without trouble on the regular elevator dumps. As compared with teams the truck showed that it would do the work of about two teams and drivers. This comparison varied according to the distance the grain was hauled. The further the haul the greater was the advantage of using a truck instead of a team or teams.

Demonstrations are still being made and anyone who is interested is asked to let Chas. Bohnenkamp know and he will be on hand to show exactly what he can do with his truck.

### AMERICAN MOTOR CARS FOR GREAT BRITAIN.

Limited Quantities May Be Admitted Under Certain Conditions.

LONDON, July 23.—(By Mail)—A large quantity of American motor

cars, possibly 5000, may be admitted into Great Britain in the next few months, says the American Chamber of Commerce in London. This will include passenger cars, commercial cars, and motorbuses.

Up to the present time, importers have been rationed on the basis of 50 per cent of their 1913 imports. In proportion to monthly quantities up to September 1, 1913, at which time the British Government's "transitional policy" is to be reconsidered. Those importers who established their businesses later than 1913 have not been getting anything at all.

The Board of Trade recently requested the American Chamber of Commerce in London to suggest a scheme which would give equitable consideration to all importers from America, old and new.

The Chamber has suggested as a basis of distribution, the yearly average of imports obtained by adding the totals for 1912-1913-1914-1915 and dividing by four. This scheme gives preference to those importers whose organizations have been in existence for a long time, but also takes into account importers who started in 1914 and 1915.

The plan has been ratified unconditionally by the importers and the Board of Trade is now circulating

the entire grade for their returns on this issue.

This is declared to be only a temporary arrangement, and not to be taken as an indication of the British Government's trade policy on motor vehicles after September 1.

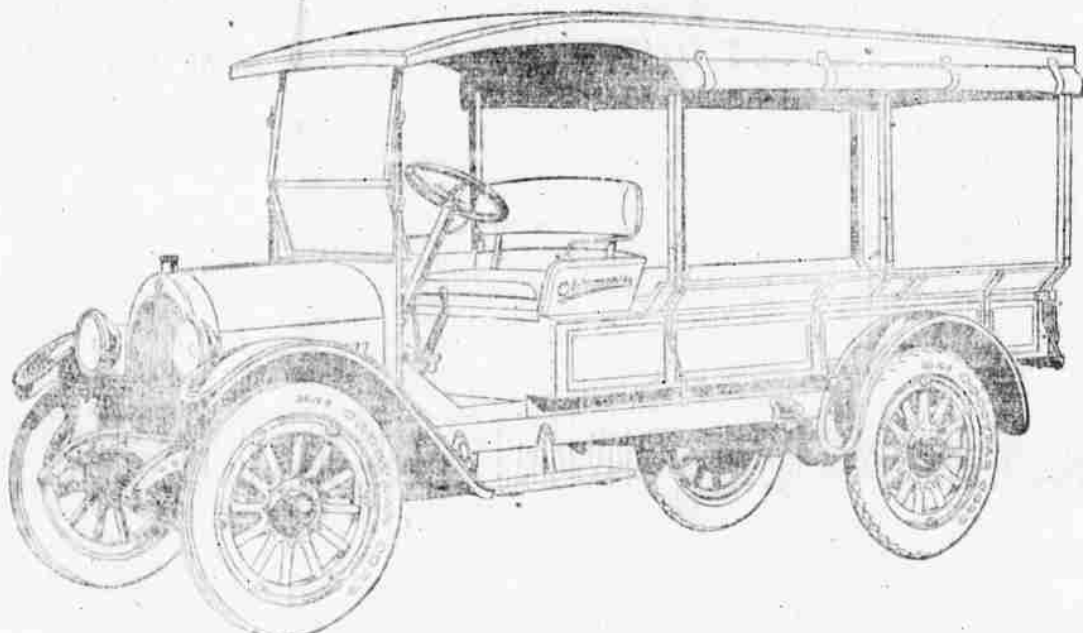
