SMUGGLE MUNITIONS OUT.

Arms Sent to Mexico as Baggage; the Navy May Act.

NEW YORK, Aug. 25.—Ten trunks containing arms and ammunition were shipped from this city to Mexico on the steamship Morra Castle, which sailed last Friday for Havana, Progresso and Vera Cruz, according to information obtained Monday by detectives attached to the booby squad. The trunks were shipped from a Broadway hotel. The department of justice and navy department expected that gun boats will be sent to intercept the steamship.

TWO MEN HELD ON NEW CHARGE

REFUSED TO ASSIST IN FIGHTING FIRE.

One on Refusing to Plead Informed that Holiday in Jail Until October Awaits Him.

Two men are lodged in the county jail as a result of refusing to aid in the suppression of forest fires when asked to.

The new government ruling, which the fire supervisor put into force last week when fighting the forest fire above Cove, is what caused the young men's arrest. The new government ruling allows the fire warden to draft anyone, unless he has a good eligible excuse, to aid in fighting fires.

When the fire warden approached the two men in question, J. P. O'Connor and Douglas Lawson, asking them to help fight fire, although they had no excuse, they refused to be drafted, saying they would not fight fire for anyone, not even the U. S. It was not long until their anarchistic utterances reached the ears of the Sheriff and some of the men were safely in the county jail to think the matter over. When called to plead their case, the one man refused to talk either way. Evidently Judge Knowles was prepared for such, for after one question, the Judge did not ask any more but said he would make a plea of "Not Guilty" for the prisoner. The prisoner seemed surprised and asked him what this meant. Then it was explained to him that by not pleading guilty and getting off by being fined, he would now have to spend several months in the county jail and stand trial at the October session of court.

Hereafter, the men to fight forest fires can be drafted just as they were for the army in past year. Unless a good excuse is given, the war will have to serve.
