School Notes

The McLeay gasoline schooner is at sea, searching for any possible remains of the gasoline schooner Rustler, which burned off Cape Blanco last Sunday. News of the disaster is meager, but the four men on board escaped in a small skiff carried on board.

J. N. Burgess, recently selected by Governor Olcott to succeed W. L. Thompson as a member of the state highway commission, informed the executive by letter that he would accept the position.

Mrs. Sarah Jane Cummins, pioneer of 1848 and within one month of her 91st year of age, died at her home in Chester, Montana, on August 11 and was buried ten days later at Weston. Mrs. Cummins made her home in Umatilla county for many years.

Harvest in Umatilla county is about 95 per cent complete and all the farmers are now busy hauling their grain to the warehouses. In 10 days they will have completed their hauling and will have nothing to do until seeding time. Reports coming in from the various warehouses indicate that about 4,300,000 bushels were raised in the county this year, between 19 and 15 per cent of this amount is being shipped in bulk.
