ONE DAY'S WORK WAS GOOD.

High Cost of Living Fight Shows
Good Record.

The following results were pro-
duced in the fight at Washington against
the high cost of living in one day:

1.—Federal Trade Commission and
Department of Justice started work-
ing on legislation to license corpora-
tions doing interstate business, as
suggested by the President, and will
unfold their plan soon to a Congress-
sional committee.

2.—Bill reported favorably by House
Agricultural Committee broadening
Food Control Act to punish all profit-
seeking retailers, big and little, and
fixing penalty of \$5,000 and two years
in prison.

3.—New cold storage bill introduced
in House, giving to Government the
control of foods in cold storage, for-
bidding storage longer than ten
months.

4.—Department of Justice advises

its agents that houses of suspi-
cious character will be visited.
5.—National board of retail mar-
kets' organizations offer support to
the Government in its fight against
hoarders and profiteers.
6.—Republican National Associa-
tion calls for release of stored food
to reduce cost of living a fallacy.
