Famous Name in Boston.

Three Josiah Quincy's have filled the office of mayor of Boston. The first Josiah Quincy to become mayor served six years, from 1823 to 1829, later becoming president of Harvard college. His son, Josiah Quincy, Jr., was mayor for three years, from 1846 to 1849, and he was the grandfather of the Josiah Quincy who was mayor for four years, from 1894 to 1899.
