CHANGING STYLES IN MOTOR CARS

A glance at the catalog of by-gone years establishes the fact that style plays an important part in motor car design as to clothing or in architecture.

The modern automobile is unquestionably a product of evolution. The most gratifying feature of motor car development, however, is that each step is marked by greater real comfort for the owner. Here styles in automobiles differ radically from fashion in clothing. While a present-day suit certainly is more pleasing to a man than garb of 1919 design, it probably does not fit him any better or make him any more comfortable.

A 1919 motor car, however, offers decided advantages over machines of former times. In early days top and windshield were regarded as extra equipment, obtainable only by paying additional charges. Self starting equipment was unknown. Many of the features which motorists of today regard as necessities were yet undreamed of.

Styles in motor cars more closely resemble developments in architecture because they mean a progress-

ive increase in real satisfaction. There is another reason, too. Auto mobile fashions change more slowly than clothing styles. A machine which optimizes the tendencies of one year will not be hopelessly out of date next. It will continue to represent good taste for a considerable period.

It is the fact, however, that styles in motor cars vary, and leading manufacturers change their cars to conform to popular demands.

The new 1919 Buick Six, for example, differs widely from the Buick of 1909, less radically from the Auburn of 1915, and very slightly from the Buick Six of 1918. This is because the Auburn designers plan each model to conform to the highest standards of good taste at the time in which it is produced. Thus the Buick Six of 1919 represents durable, tempered by experience, modifications attained and the sleekness of modernity stands at the zenith of fashion today. It will be in good taste 5 years from now.

In my opinion, the performance of Auburn beauty is one of the strongest recommendations of the Buick Six.
