"THE FALSE FACES" SPLEN-DID DRAMA OF WAR AND SPIES

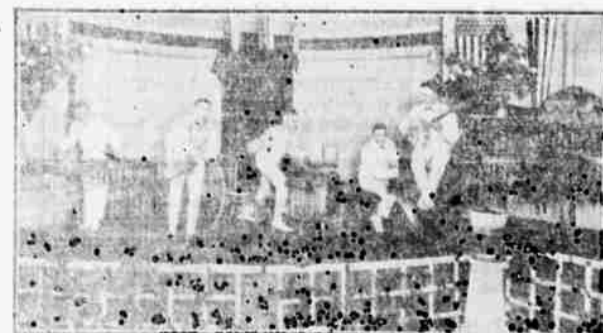
