

BIRD SEASON OPENS SEPT. 15

THE STATE GAME WARDEN
ANNOUNCES DATE FOR HUNTING

Eastern Oregon Ducks
Back to the Western States
of Mexico

The federal season for duck shooting will begin in Eastern Oregon on September 15, and will be closely followed by the state game authorities, according to a letter received yesterday by J. W. Walden, district game warden for Union and Walla-wa counties from Carl D. Shoemaker, state game warden. The eastern Oregon season will then close on December 31.

Following is the letter received by Mr. Walden, relative to the third season:

Mr. J. W. Walden,
Dist. Game Warden, La Grande.
Dear Sir:

"The federal season for duck shooting will be followed by the state game authorities. For all of western Oregon, or game district No. 1, which takes in all the counties west of the summit of the Cascade mountains, the season opens on October 1st and closes January 15th, both days inclusive. For eastern Oregon, or game district No. 2, the season opens on September 15th and closes on December 31st, both days inclusive.

"The courts have uniformly held that the federal law is supreme and if seasons are to be changed they must come through the federal government and not the state. Sportsmen throughout Oregon, will therefore, observe the federal law and seasons with reference to the shooting of ducks. However, all other provisions of the state laws, with the exception of the opening and closing dates will be enforced as there is no conflict with reference to bag limits, hours for shooting and methods of pursuit. The bag limit for migratory birds is twenty-five in any one day and not to exceed thirty in any seven consecutive days."

contemplable partisan unworthy of citizenship because we want to make safe our own position for the future that if ever our position is weakened we lose all hope of serving the world and fulfilling our destiny as the leader of true democracy.

It is the madness of desperation and he is using a brand of vilification which will act as a hammer for when he returns to Washington and views the cold facts away from those whose object is to flatter and exalt him, he will find that his trip and his speeches have had the effect only of strengthening the resolve to do sworn constitutional duty and that while the treaty of peace and League of Nations will be ratified it will be with such alterations as will conform to American safety and national security and happiness."

"The people must return to the policy of careful buying and regular saving if they wish to help the situation. The treasury department in order to combat this artificial situation, is intensifying and speeding up its thrift campaign. Statements on the principles of finance and the laws of investment and budgetary are being brought to workers in factories; to farmers; to business and professional men, and members of women's organizations by means of printed publicity and the spoken word. A nationwide attack upon swindlers who are persuading people to dispose of their Liberty Bonds and War Savings Stamps is also being inaugurated.

"Throughout New England, savings and thrift organizations already are exerting their combined efforts to combat increased cost of the necessities of life. Saving directors and hundreds of officers of savings societies are taking the lead in disseminating information as to fair prices.

"In their communities they are aiding the determination and publication of fair prices and in curbing unjust profits. They are following the plan of campaign recently outlined by Governor W. P. C. Harding, of the federal reserve board, to promote regular and efficient work to increase production and insure reasonable economies to devote that production to necessities rather than extravagances and luxuries.

"Steps are being taken to insure similar efforts throughout the other federal reserve districts."

BOLSHEVIKS MEET DECISIVE DEFEAT

LONDON, Sept. 13.—The war office announced a decisive victory over the Bolshevik forces in Tsaritsyn by General Denikin, in which 9000 prisoners, 11 guns and 100 machine guns were taken.

Three Bolshevik regiments surrendered and two others were destroyed.

CLEVELAND, Sept. 9.—With some 2000 delegates the international convention of the United Mine Workers of America was called to order in probably the most important meeting in the history of the United Mine Workers, since, quite apart from the possibilities of trouble contained in its almost certain demands for higher wages and shorter hours, the miners of Great Britain are looking to it for support in the questions of the six-hour day and 40-hour week and of the nationalization of coal mines.

Acting President John L. Lewis in his report to the convention, discussed the greatly increased cost of living and the improbability of any sweeping reduction through "belated" federal action as a preface to his recommendation for a cancellation of the Washington wage agreement in the bituminous field not later than November 1, and the negotiation of a new wage scale, to be enforced, in case of failure to reach a satisfactory settlement by that time, by a general miners' strike throughout the entire jurisdiction of the United Mine Workers of America. The basis of the proposed agreement should be that outlined by the national policy meeting held at Indianapolis in March, calling for the six-hour day and five-day week and "substantial" wage increases, the report said.

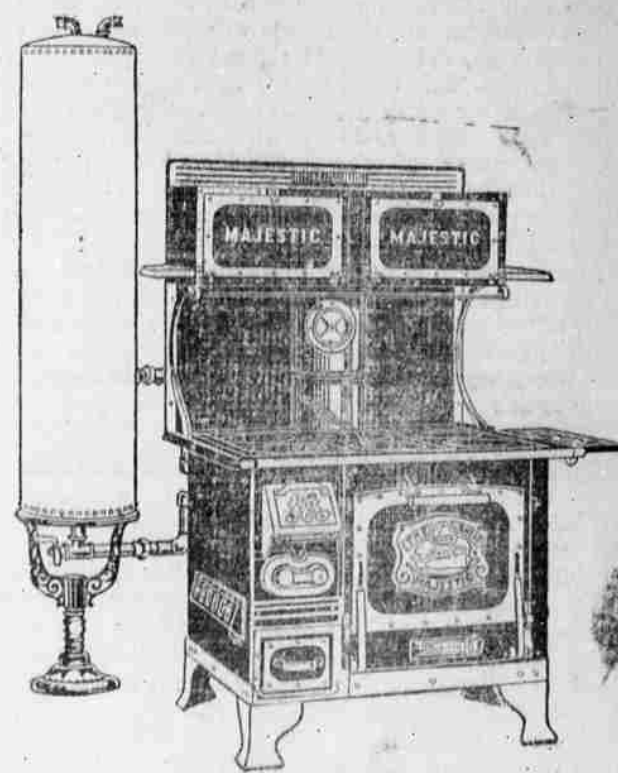
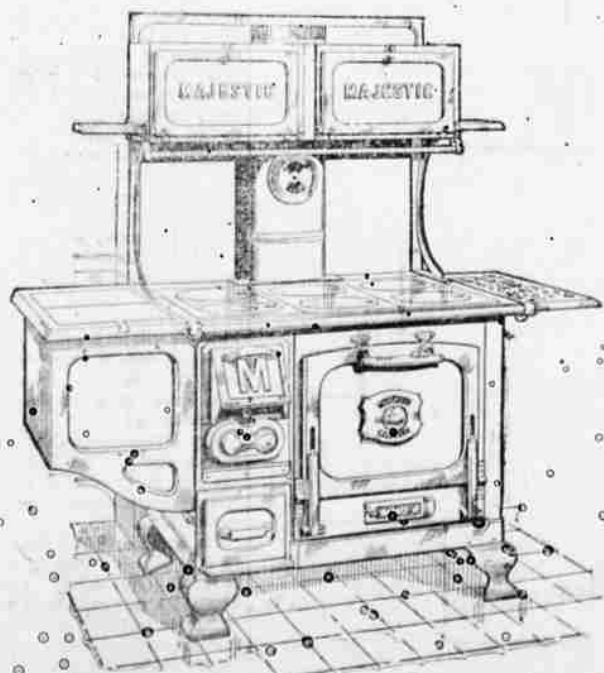
