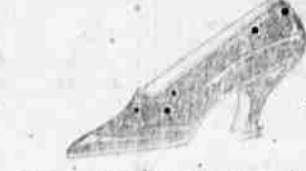

Island City Road to Be Made a First Class Highway

Hennett, accompanied by George H. Hubby, construction superintendent and G. M. Patterson, resident manager for the contractors visited the roadway and made a thorough inspection. Mr. Whitmore explained to the committee that he had found several places where the surface was below grade, that there were also several places where sections of the pavement had been taken for inspection purposes which had not been properly replaced and that there were other places where the surface was uneven, though the mix there was according to specifications and the material up to standard. He requested the contractors to raise the low places, trim off the high places and properly fill the openings caused by the removal of the laboratory samples, and continue with the work of placing the crushed rock shoulders on both sides of the pavement. Mr. Whitmore explained that the road was not yet completed. He further instructed the contractors to see that the surface was thoroughly tamped out and properly smoothed over the entire width of the pavement. The contractors also in turn assured the committee that it was their intention to make the correction ordered by the state engineer at once and it would be their aim to complete the job in a workmanlike manner.

Mr. Tolson, as chairman of the meeting, made it plain to both engineers and contractors that it was the intention of the road commission & the Union County Ad. Club to see that the road in Union county should be up to standard and that the specifications must be adhered to without exception. Said Mr. Tolson:

"We want good roads for Union county, and will insist that every dollar expended buy a full dollar's worth of good road value."
