THE DEUTSCHLAND WILL BE EXHIBITED

(Correspondence of the Associated Press.)

LONDON, Sept. 1.—Since the surrender of the famous German cargo submarine Deutschland, which created a sensation by her trip to the United States in 1916, and back to her home port, she has been overhauled and now is beginning a tour of British coast towns. She will be open to inspection by the public in aid of King George's fund for sailors.

Alterations have been made so that visitors can pass into the interior without having to descend the steep iron ladder from the conning tower. Her guns have been dismantled.

The Deutschland was among the 27 or more German submarines surrendered by Germany after the armistice and delivered to British naval authorities in English ports.

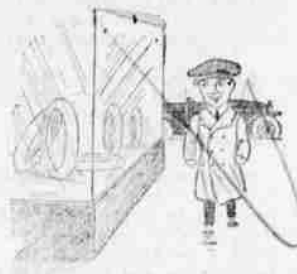

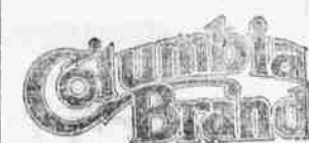
