**COLORADO EDUCATORS TO HOLD MEETING**

GRAND JUNCTION, COLO., Oct. 2.—The 14th annual meeting of the Colorado Educational Association will be held in this city on November 4, 5 and 6, and according to present indications, the session is to be one of the most important as well as the best attended that has ever been recorded in the history of the organization. It is expected that more than 500 teachers will attend the sessions. Among the speakers who have accepted invitations to address the gathering are Dr. Ernest C. Moore of the University of California, Miss Katherine D. Blake of New York City, and President E. B. Bryan of Colgate university. A number of other prominent speakers and educators have also been placed on the program.

John A. Saxson of Sterling, Colo., is president of the association.

One of the most serious problems which confronts those in charge of the gathering is the matter of accommodations for the visiting teachers.

At the same time the association members are meeting in this city, two other divisions of the Colorado Educational Association will meet at Pueblo and at Denver.
