MUNICIPAL BOXING SHOW

AT ARCADE THEATRE TUESDAY NIGHT, OCTOBER 7

Gordon-Rocco Ten Round Main Event Promises to Be a Sensational Exhibition

Gordon and Rocco are two aggressive bantams who have never met in the ring and there exists a rivalry between the two that is sure to bring out the best that is in them. For this reason the set-to, as arranged by the municipal boxing commission for Tuesday evening, will no doubt be the best exhibition ever seen in La Grande.

Pat Bradley of St. Paul, known in the middle west as the Fighting Black Irishman, has the distinction of being the former sparring partner of Mike Gibbons and is considered the best colored boy of his weight in the west. He boxed a draw with Jack Blackburn, the colored middleweight champion of the United States, knocked out Joe Swain in three rounds, beat Romeo Hagan in six rounds and has credit for many other victories over well known men in his class.

Freddie Payne who will box Pat Bradley the colored boy for the La Grande Municipal Boxing Commission on the 7th, is a heavy welter weight and was the champion of Mare Island during his service in the marines. He has never met Bradley. He knocked out Leo Le Mars in one round, knocked out Jack Lane of San Francisco in second round, putting John Thompson of San Francisco away in two rounds and has beaten many other good boys, usually winning his battles before they go far. He has the Dempsey style of boxing, can hit hard with either hand and while he is not considered a spectacular boxer he is considered a dangerous opponent for any middle-weight in the country. He was former sparring partner of Steve Dalton of Los Angeles. His fight with the colored boy should be the most interesting thing seen here in a long time.

Both boys will weigh around 125 when they enter the ring. The contest is to be a catch weight affair.

C. H. Bushler, chairman of the Municipal Boxing Commission is in receipt of a letter from W. R. Eynthe, manager of George Thompson, the San Francisco bantam who boxed Billy Maseott a ten round draw in Portland on the 14th, challenging the winner of the Gordon-Rocco match to be held at the Arcade on October 7th. The letter was written at San Francisco, and shows La Grande has already been recognized as a good sporting town.

A. C. Hampton, president of the State Teachers' Association, is very much elated over the fact that up to date, six counties of the state of Oregon have gone over the top for 100 per cent membership in the State Teachers' association.

The counties making such a record are Malheur, Klamath, Wasco, Deschutes, Jackson and Douglas. Union and Baker counties do not hold their teachers' institute until next week, so they have not had an opportunity to be one of this list. Mr. Hampton hopes very much that both Baker and Union counties will measure up to this standard.

It was due to the State Teachers' association that the last legislature passed the bill stating that the minimum salary of teachers in any district was to be not less than \$75. This raised the salaries of practically 1500 teachers, automatically raising their salaries from 40 to 50 per cent. The teachers are now showing their appreciation of this teachers' association and are gladly paying their dollar dues which makes them a member. Mr. Hampton says he has every reason to believe that every teacher in Union and Baker counties will join this organization.


