COURT SETTLES SEVERAL CASES. The October session of the circuit court here settled with several cases so far. The case of A. C. Spain vs. Stanley Shaw occupied the attention of the court on Tuesday. The main argument was over some pasture and fencing. Shaw had a half interest in the pasture and straw on the Spain place and when he settled for the same, was supposed to fix up the fence around the pasture, and in the settlement, was allowed \$32.50 for fixing the fence. The fence was not fixed and outside stock got into the pasture and fence and the jury granted Spain a judgment of \$32.50. The case of the city vs. Joseph South was dismissed, and the case of the state vs. C. W. Friswold did not come up for trial Thursday as scheduled. Yesterday afternoon was taken up with the Strong case wherein Mrs. Delbert Strong had her husband arrested for non-support. At a late hour this afternoon the case had not gone to the jury. Since Mrs. Strong had filed suit for a divorce. Robert Packard, who has been held on two charges, one for stealing an automobile from in front of the court house and the other charge for the burglary of a store in Union, was tried on the charge of burglary and was found guilty. The sentence had three companions in the theft and burglary, one of whom escaped from the county jail some time ago, and the other two plead guilty to the theft of the auto and were given terms in the penitentiary. Packard did not confess at that time, nor would he have a lawyer when he came up for trial. As he was tried on the more serious charge of the two for which he was held, that of burglary, his sentence will probably be heavier.

DRASTIC LIGHTING REGULATIONS MADE TO STRETCH SUPPLIES OF COAL. BERTLIN, Oct. 10.—Drastic lighting restrictions intended to save fuel were published September 19. No one may use more than 50 per cent of the quantity of gas or electricity consumed during the same quarter of the year 1918. Restaurants, cafes, hotels, concert halls and other places of amusement may use only up to 35 per cent of that employed in 1918. Street lighting is reduced to 20 per cent.
