WILL OCCUPY WESLEY'S PULPIT

Rapid Rise of British Clergyman who Was Once a Newshy.

Correspondence of the Associated Press, LONDON, Sept. 17.—The Rev. Walter H. Armstrong, who began the other day, his ministry at Wesley's Chapel here, where he occupies John Wesley's own pulpit, once sold papers in the London streets. He earned about 10 cents a day as newsboy. When eleven years old he left school and became a telegraph messenger and later a postman. Then he began to devote his earnings to studying for the ministry. After serving as a missionary in the Far East, he returned to England and conducted the largest men's religious meetings in London, with an attendance of 2,000 Sunday after Sunday.

According to the British press, his virile personality is bound to leave an impress upon the life of the famous church which was the center of Wesleyan Methodism.

"It is not my intention," he said, "to start anything sensational. My belief is that the church exists not to let its soil for every wind that blows, but to raise the whole standard of life. I believe in the application of Christian principle to every aspect of modern life. A narrow Christianity is no Christianity at all."

ALLEGIANCE TO AUSTRIA IS AVOWED BY MANY.

VIENNA, Sept. 10.—Austria, since the collapse, has no need to fear emigration, for in the time between November, 1918, and July, 1919, no less than 100,000 naturalizations have taken place. The majority of them are of residents of Bohemia and Moravia of German ancestry who, rather than come under Czech rule and be Czech citizens, have rushed to Vienna and taken on German-Austrian citizenship. Many others, refugees, most of them, have also swept in and applied for citizenship as Austrians rather than Galicians or Hungarians because they are of German origin. Many have taken the move in an attempt to avoid the confiscation of their fortunes.

WILHELM PURCHASES HOMES FOR SERVANTS

AMONGERN, Sept. 17.—The former German Emperor is understood to have purchased several villas for the use of his servants at Doorn where his new home is located. The villagers say that he intends to take a large personnel to Doorn, necessitating the requirement of about twenty houses.

State News

A buffalo cow, quite tame and unharmed, is reported remaining in the Oatridge hill vicinity of Douglas county.

Miss Rosa Kippen, graduate of the University of Colorado, is the new professor of Spanish at the University of Oregon.

Plans are being made for a big homecoming week on the campus of Oregon Agricultural college October 24, 25 and 26.

The daily payroll for apple pickers in the Hood River section is more than \$500. Receipts in wages for the season will exceed \$225,000.

The total prune production of Douglas county this year is said to be 8,000,000 pounds, which will bring approximately \$1,200,000.

A churchman's association has been organized at Pendleton, with three accredited members from each of the Protestant congregations.

It is announced in North Bend that a prosperous colony of French farmers located in Washington are planning to move to Crook county to engage in farming and dairying.

Issuance of 2250,000 in bonds to finance irrigation of 25,000 acres of the Linnell valley in Klamath county, was approved Saturday at a special election of taxpayers.

Five former citizens of Germany were refused citizenship at Dallas last week on the ground that petition for their first papers were not filed at least two years before the declaration of war.

Shipments of peaches and pears by the Ashland Fruit & Produce association have passed the record mark of 46 carloads this season. In

dependent shippers have sent about 30 carloads by express.

Deputies have been assigned to their card of education by the teachers of 30 schools in North Bend for an increase in salaries of \$25 a month, effective Jan. 1 in the beginning of the present session.

Arthur Waters, a British recently released from the Mexican military and deported from Astoria last week, told the officers that he had changed up \$10,000 while three weeks in Portland before he was caught.

GEISHA GIRLS GET A RAISE.

HONOLULU, T. H., Sept. 9.—Japanese Geisha girls of Honolulu, have won a short-lived strike for an increase of pay and bonuses will receive \$1.50 an hour, an increase of 25 cents over the former rate. Ten Geisha proprietors will pass the additional entertainment cost on to their patrons. The Geisha girls demanded the increase because of the high cost of living. Rice has gone up several dollars a sack.
