SERBIA IS FREE FROM SMALLPOX

BELGRADE, Sept. 5.—For the first time in five years, Serbia is today free of smallpox. Only three cases are reported in the whole kingdom. The announcement is made by the medical staff of the American Red Cross headquarters in Belgrade which a week ago made the even more gratifying announcement that Serbia is once more free of typhus, after a struggle of five years.

To the efforts of relief workers of half a dozen nations that rallied to the Serbian call of distress in the black winter of 1915, the government freely ascribes the eradication of the twin plagues. Chief among these workers were those of the American Red Cross which is today operating a chain of eight hospitals in Serbia.

FALL SALE WILL BE HELD AT FAIRGROUNDS OCTOBER 25.

Union County Is Rapidly Gaining Reputation for Thoroughbred Stock.

At the time of our first annual Short-horn sale at La Grande on May 1st it was decided to hold a fall sale of Short-horn cattle at La Grande, on October 25th. On that date there will again be sold pure bred Short-horn cattle at public auction on the fair grounds. This will be held in the pavilion, as weather conditions at this time of year are uncertain.

Consignors to this sale are: G. T. Paul, La Grande; W. O. Cammings, Mount Vernon; Mrs. Anna Jackson, North Powder; Davis Bros., Union; W. W. Green, Union; C. W. Delany, Hereford; W. S. Gentry, Hot Lake. The sale will consist of pure bred Short-horn cattle, three bulls and three cows, mostly of the Red and White breeds. The time of the sale is subject to change. The sale will be held at the fair grounds at La Grande. The sale is for the benefit of the many breeders of pure bred

livestock in this immediate vicinity, making this one of the greatest districts of pure bred livestock in the state. As a matter of fact, this section is just making a beginning in this direction and is already known far and wide for its great stock.

DENIKINE TAKEN TOWN AND 2000 PRISONERS

LONDON, Oct. 14.—A wireless communication from General Denikine Monday claims further victories against the Bolsheviks in the direction of Orel and also in the region of Kiev. General Denikine announces the capture of Ostrozhensky Vashno (a town which cannot be located on available maps) with 1500 prisoners. The Bolsheviks made an attack upon his army with large forces in the vicinity of Orel, but were unsuccessful. General Denikine captured 2500 prisoners and occupied Krovie (possibly Kromy, about 25 miles southwest of Orel).

General Denikine's forces also occupied the important provincial capital of Chernigoff, about 75 miles north of Kiev. The advance continues.

FOUNDATION NOW LAID FOR WOMEN'S BUILDING.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Oct. 14.—Work began on the Women's building August 20 when the ground was broken for excavation. The foundation is now laid and as the work is progressing the building will be completed within a year.

The building will be 100 by 200 feet and will contain a large swimming pool, club and committee rooms and several guest rooms. The physical education and domestic science departments will be housed in this new building.

Lawrence and Holford, of Portland of which Ellis Fuller Lawrence, dean of the University school of architecture is a member, are the architects of the building. W. O. Heckart was given the contract for the outside work. Contracts have not yet been made for the interior.

During the summer approximately \$70,000 was raised through subscription for the building fund, of which over \$50,000 has been paid in. It was necessary to raise this amount before an additional \$50,000 would be given by the state which would allow the work to be started on the building. Contracts amounting to an expenditure of \$80,000 have been awarded. When completed the building will cost about \$200,000, half of the amount being raised by the University and the rest given by the state.

Less difficulty is expected in raising the funds necessary to complete the building now that the work has actually begun. A sum of \$30,000 still to be raised will probably be subscribed by the students who have not yet given a definite subscription to the building fund.

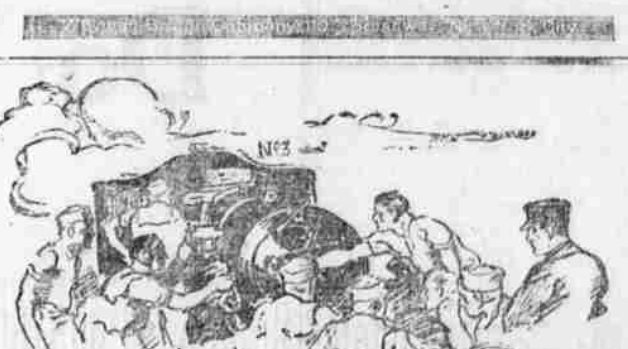
