The quantity of rain which falls is measured by rain-gauges or pluviometers, which are variously constructed. One of the best is that known as Symon's rain-gauge, consisting of a funnel-shaped receiving vessel to catch the rain, and a glass measure of much smaller diameter to measure it. To simplify calculation, the internal area of the measure is usually one-tenth that of the mouth of the funnel.

CITY MANAGERS REPORT.

To the Honorable Commission City of La Grande, Oregon.

Gentlemen: I have to report for the week ending October 11: From the recorder's office—Licenses issued, dray, 3; building permits, 2. Receipts for fines, \$480. Pound fees, \$2. Board of state prisoners, \$5.95. Warrants issued, \$2709.25.

From the treasurer's office:

Table with Receipts and Disbursements columns. Receipts: For water rents \$1,261.60, Improvement District Installments 929.29, Improvement District Interest 319.15, Licenses 15.00, Electrical permits 2.00, Building permits 1.00, Penalties 10.18, Advertising 49. Total \$2,478.11. Disbursements: For general warrants \$2,248.00, General warrant interest \$2.78, Improvements bonds 1,090.60, Improvement District interest 21.0. Total \$3,452.37.

Total \$3,452.37. From the fire department, one call to box 33, the alarm having been turned in by some one on account of the burning of a red fence near Spruce and Y avenue. No damage.

From the police department, arrest for the week, 23. For the state, 3 for drunkenness, 3; for traffic violations, 11. Fines collected, \$430. Pound fees, \$2. On Sunday morning October 12, the department was called on to arrest some parties aboard passenger train No. 17, westbound, suspected of robbing a bank in Springsville, Utah. The arrest was made not withstanding the fact that the department received notice only twelve minutes before train time. These prisoners were turned over to the Utah authorities who feel confident they are part of a gang that has been operating in different parts of the West.

The street force in addition to the usual routine work has been employed in making repairs to streets and crosswalks and otherwise getting things in shape for the winter. Some repairs were also made on the floor of the Second street viaduct by setting in pieces of plank where old ones were worn through. It is the opinion of the city engineer, the street superintendent and myself that repairs of this character from time to time will keep the floor of the viaduct in pretty good shape until next year, when it will probably be necessary to put on a new floor.

The water department reports two new taps for the week and the repair of a number of meters as well as the installation of a number of new meter boxes or tiles. The force at the intake is progressing with the new dam and it is expected that the cement work will be completed by the end of this week.

How Frogs Protect Eggs.

In the manner of depositing their eggs many species of frog exhibit remarkable peculiarities. One of the most curious, a tree frog, native of Paraguay, makes its nest in a bush overhanging a pond. The lower ends of a number of leaves are drawn together and fixed in that position by a number of empty egg capsules. The eggs are also covered with a shield of empty capsules to protect them from the sun and air. When the eggs are hatched the plug at the bottom appears to fall out and the tadpoles tumble into the water.
