rest of offenders who have escaped. The inquiries are to be held in secret, but a shorthand writer will be present and in case any prisoner is apprehended a copy of the depositions taken in to be supplied to him before his trial.

The plan revives what was known in the eighties as the "Star Chamber Court." It was under this system that the inquiries were held which resulted in the capture and execution of the Phoenix Park murders who on May 6, 1882, assassinated the chief secretary, Lord Frederick Cavendish.

means for the trial of offenders and a greater probability of their conviction. They can now be tried by two resident magistrates instead of by the usual petty sessions benches and there is in every case an appeal from the decision to the county court judge.

The proclamation of Dublin, Tipperary, Limerick, Clare and Cork under the first section of the Crimes Act of 1887 has a different purpose. It is aimed at the discovery of offenders who have escaped detection. It gives power to a resident magistrate to hear a case and take evidence. Witnesses can be examined on oath and bound over to appear at the future trial of whatever prisoner the evidence implicates.

The inquiries authorized by the new proclamation may, it is apparently expected, facilitate the collection of conclusive evidence and lead to the ar-

ARCTIC EXPLORERS ON THEIR RETURN

Correspondence of the Associated Press. NOME, Alaska, Sept. 26.—Martin Killin and Adelfort Gunner, the last two members of Vilhjalmur Stefansson's Canadian Arctic Expedition to leave the Arctic, are reported aboard the trading schooner *Anna Olexa*, which is working its way toward Nome along the northern coast of Alaska.

Killin and Gunner were not members of Stefansson's original party. They were members of a party Storker, Storkerson, Stefansson's lieutenant, led onto an ice floe last year in the hope that the Arctic drifts would carry the floe westward to Siberia. After spending eight months on the ice the men found themselves about fifty miles from their starting point. They all came ashore and Storkerson and

one other landed overland for the outside world. Killin and Gunner boarded the *Olexa* and started for Nome.

Stefansson's trip outside was his first in eleven years. He has been an explorer, trader and trapper along the northern rim of the continent ever since 1908. He expects to associate himself with Stefansson in handling the Canadian government's proposal to stock the northern tundra plains with reindeer.

NEW PAYSTREAK

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, Sept. 2.—(By Mail)—Renewed life to the Fairbanks district on Solomon creek appears to be promised as the result of the recent discovery of a new paystreak.
