PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE MENTIONED IN BIBLE

"I commended unto you Phoebe, our sister, who is a servant of the Church which is at Cenchrea," wrote St. Paul to the Romans, "that ye assist her in whatsoever business she hath need of you, for she hath been a merciful minister of many and of myself also."
 Phoebe, an explicit Biblical history, was a woman who went about nursing the sick and teaching them better methods of living. Phoebe was the first public health nurse.
 Public health nursing, which is one of the most important professions in the present program of the American Red Cross, is not a new movement, but it is one which heretofore has never received the just need of attention as a factor in maintaining the health of the nation.
 Phoebe's sister in the twentieth century is the community nurse who teaches better, cleaner living. Because the betterment of public health is now definitely accepted as an individual and a community responsibility, the Red Cross will make a definite effort to raise the standards of living in the United States by urging the employment of public health nurses in all cities, towns and rural districts, particularly in those where there are no organized public health activities. A healthier, happier America—that is what the Red Cross is striving toward in its Roll Call the first weeks in November.

ENTERED SUIT BY ME. INTO THE RED CROSS

"Sixteen thousand mothers die in childbirth every year in the United States of America, more than are thus sacrificed in any other country of importance in the civilized world. The American Red Cross has announced its belief that these mothers, the very flower of the womanhood of America and heroines every one, shall no longer die through ignorance or neglect, if the public health nursing resources of the country can possibly be extended to give them the necessary care. This is one of the reasons for the Third Red Cross Roll Call which begins Sunday, November 2.

MERCY WOMEN PRODUCE FORTUNE IN GARMENTS

More than 8,000,000 women and girls participated in the sewing and knitting of the American Red Cross during the war. Most of these workers will be active in soliciting members for the Red Cross for 1920, during the ten days ending Armistice Day. When it is remembered that these women and girls in two years' time produced nearly \$100,000,000 worth of surgical articles and garments, including more than 375,000,000 surgical dressings, the fact that they are to assist in the Roll Call is a practical assurance that universal membership will be achieved.

PHEASANTS TO BE MORE PLENTIFUL

GAME COMMISSION BELIEVES THEY WILL INCREASE.

Holdup Men Get in Their Work in Umatilla County—Clubs to Exhibit.

 If things go right, there should be 24,000 new China pheasants ready for the sportsmen next year, calculates Frank Warren, member of the state game and fish commission, who left for Lane county yesterday, to look over the pheasant farms. "We will hold over 4000 birds," said Commissioner Warren, "and each pair should, average 10 birds next year after they are released and this will give 20,000 birds, and counting the 4000 turned loose, this makes 24,000. It looks to me as though the logical thing to do is to hold the birds over until spring. Releasing birds in the fall has not been entirely satisfactory. The birds have to face the rains and cold, and many are lost before spring comes. By sheltering the birds until spring and then releasing them they have several months before them in which to propagate, and the climatic conditions will be favorable. The Chinas have never recovered from our silver thaw. When a bird gets under a tree and his long tail feathers touch the ground he is anchored there by ice until he dies."

FAMOUS PLAYWRIGHT IS MARGARET MAYO "POOR BOOB" AUTHOR
 Writer of Bryant Washburn's New Starring Vehicle Well Known Dramatist.

Margaret Mayo, who wrote the original stage version of "Poor Boob" which will be seen at the Arcade theatre Thursday with Bryant Washburn as star, is a farce writer with a huge list of successes to her credit.
 One of the first plays to bring her into public notice was "Polly of the Circus," a play which had such a universal appeal that it ran for a long time in New York, toured the country repeatedly, and still holds its own in stock companies everywhere.

A few years ago she turned her hand to farce writing, and produced "Baby Mine," which was probably the most successful play of its kind ever written. New York sent word over it, and several road companies were sent out to play it. It also had a long run in London.
