RED CROSS GIRLS FEED THOUSANDS OF DOUGHBOYS

Since the armistice, twenty-five canteens, operated by Red Cross Chapters in Idaho, Oregon, and Washington have dispensed 23,379 gallons of coffee, and 224,336 dozen sandwiches, to soldiers, sailors, and marines on route. The hospitality of these canteens was accepted nine hundred thousand times, often by men who would have gone hungry but for the Red Cross service thus rendered. Figures show that these men, through the courtesy of the Red Cross, drank 8,487 gallons of iced drinks; used 6,692 bars of soap, and 37,713 paper towels; ate 57,491 chocolate bars, 18,529 pounds of candy, 14,754 dozen cookies, 74,313 dozen doughnuts, 5,488 dozen hot rolls; wrote 425,409 post cards furnished and stamped by the Red Cross; and to their own discomfort during a certain period, wore 12,250 influenza masks. All this, to say nothing of 22,956 full meals. During this time 1847 sick men were aided by the canteen, seventy-nine of them being removed from trains as too sick to travel, and receiving immediate hospital attention. Canteen work is nearly over, but the Red Cross still has vitally important work to do. Every membership in the Third Red Cross Roll Call will be a vote of confidence in the American Red Cross.

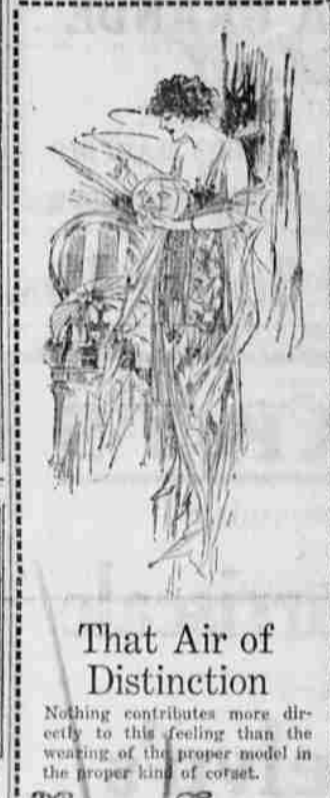
