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COUNTY MEETING NEXT SATURDAY

MISS ZORN DOING GOOD WORK AMONG SCHOOLS.

Union Co. Public Health Association to be Formed at 2:30 in the City Hall.

Indications are good for a splendid meeting of people from all sections of the county in La Grande next Saturday afternoon when an organization for backing up the work of our county public health nurse will be perfected. This meeting will be held at 2:30 in the City Hall.

It is proposed to form an association similar to that in other counties in the state where public health nurses are at work. The organization will be called The Union

County Public Health Association.

That the work which Miss Louise Zorn has been doing in the county during the past two months has met with the unqualified approval of parents and teachers is quite evident as one goes about over the county to the different communities, states Miss Jane Allen, State Advisory nurse. In the six weeks just ended 26 schools, both town and rural, have been visited and 665 pupils have been inspected for symptoms of physical defects. The findings of the nurse are as follows:

- Defective teeth 100
- Enlarged neck glands 187
- Abnormal tonsils 201
- Nasal obstruction 143
- Anaemia 30
- Defective vision 196
- Defective hearing 8
- Defective extremities 5

Parents Get Sealed Note.

In each case a sealed note was sent home to the parents of the child advising them to take the child to the family physician or dentist for diagnosis and care. Later on home visits will be made by Miss Zorn for the purpose of explaining to the parents the needs for this attention and to help them arrange to have the child receive proper care.

In addition to the inspection of the pupils, Miss Zorn has given 75 class room talks on health and proper habits of living, has made a routine inspection of the schoolhouses visited, looking into sanitary conditions as to toilets, drinking water facilities, classroom lighting, etc.

Each visit in a community also includes some home visiting in that neighborhood to infant welfare, prenatal and tuberculosis cases. As the work becomes better known it is hoped that the number of such cases for the nurse to visit and give advisory care will increase greatly for it is in the homes that the nurse can get in a very valuable work in raising the standard of health of the entire community.

It can readily be seen that with such a splendid beginning as has been made in the past few weeks, Union County presents a promising field for the accomplishment of far-reaching good along these lines. The people who realize this should see that the meeting next Saturday is a big and enthusiastic one for a getting together at this time of all those who are willing to give their support to this movement and to have a hand in placing it on a permanent basis is essential at this stage of the work.

for milk production by the six testing associations in August. Their average yield was 697.52 pounds of milk carrying 30.44 pounds of fat. Big as this yield is, it is far below the production of the best of the herd which averaged 1392 pounds of milk with 47.56 pounds of fat. The heavy test milk producer was a Holstein cow giving 1779 pounds milk, and the biggest fat yielders were a Holstein and a grade Jersey giving 76.14 pounds each.

Red Cross Adopts 500 Devastated Villages

LONDON, Sept. 20.—Five hundred small towns and villages in the devastated regions of France have been "adopted" by the British Committee of the French Red Cross Society. The inhabitants of each of these hamlets are being assisted in their struggle to reestablish themselves in their former homes. In many instances they are living in the cellars of their ruined houses. Other returned refugees have to be content with living under sheets of corrugated iron leaned against a bit of broken wall.

American Red Cross Turns Over Large Supply Food To Russian Red Cross

ARCHANGEL, Sept. 5.—American Red Cross supplies valued at four and a half million rubles have been turned over to the Russian Red Cross for use and distribution in Northern Russia. The goods consist principally of food, clothing, medical and hospital supplies.

This stock was on hand at the time of the withdrawal of the American mission, following the departure of the American forces from the Archangel area. In making this gift, Major D. O. Lively, of San Francisco, Red Cross Commissioner for North Russia, directed that the Russians follow the same regulations of distribution as observed by the Americans who spent one year in this district.

Caruso Sings to 15,000 People in Mexican Bull Ring

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 5.—(By Mail.)—The unusual spectacle was presented today of 15,000 persons sitting under their umbrellas in Mexico City's famous bull ring listening to Enrico Caruso, wearing a heavy rubber cape as protection against the rain, sing the role of "Don Jose" in "Carmen." It was a picturesque setting for this opera in a bull ring, which until a few years ago attracted the world's best matadors and picadores.

The performance started under dark skies and during the third act a heavy rain began falling. At the end of the act the management announced that because of the rain the performance would be suspended. Fifteen thousand persons rose in their seats and shouted in opposition until the arena shook. They demanded that the opera proceed and in much as by this time the rain had ceased the fourth act was sung and completed, although occasional flashes of lightning and low-lying clouds forecast the storm that broke shortly after the finale.

Next in popularity to Caruso was Gabrielle Besanzoni, Italian contralto, who sang "Carmen." Mme. Besanzoni makes her debut this fall with the Metropolitan Opera company in New York.
