WANTS TO TRAIN FOR 1920 MATCH

ALL COLLEGES URGED TO DEVELOP GALLERY PRACTICE

War Department Wants O. A. C. To Join National Rifle Association For Rifle Promotion.

CORVALLIS, Oct. 29.—The military department of the college is being urged by the war department to join the National Rifle Association for the promotion of rifle practice and take part in indoor, small caliber matches which are expected to begin immediately after Christmas.

It is urged that steps be taken immediately so that 18 may be trained and entered for the 1920 matches. The War Department wishes to encourage team practice in the various colleges of the country. It is not intended to develop gallery practice at the expense of any possible outdoor practice at the college and other institutions where outdoor matches are possible. Every advantage is expected to be taken to encourage the students to take part in this type of instruction.

SIX-Toed Cat.

A cat having six well developed toes on a foot was brought into the department of veterinary medicine by Prof. C. S. Brewster of the poultry department. Following an operation Dr. B. T. Simms, professor of veterinary medicine, pronounced the animal normal. Professor Brewster got the cat from W. W. Coons, of Corvallis who has a distinct strain of odd-toed cats. With a few exceptions, all the kittens have six toes. The toes are on the inside of the leg and are as well developed as the others.

A triangular debate series in which the Oregon Agricultural college, the University of Oregon and Reed College will compete is a possibility as a result of a visit paid to the campus by "Abe" Rosenberg, forensic manager for the University of Oregon.

Chance to Make Letter in Soccer.

All men who are not able to make major letters in varsity sports now have a chance to make minor letters in soccer. This sport was recognized by the student body Wednesday and any man playing these halves in one season will be awarded a sweater with a minor sport emblem. The kicking style of football is coming to the front rapidly in the large eastern colleges and is expected to become a leading sport in the west. Numerous games are being arranged with the University of Oregon, Reed College and other Portland teams. All men who have had experience in soccer are expected to turn out every day between 4 and 6 o'clock.

City, who died recently from the effects of flu contracted last fall and whose wife died last November from the same cause, are awaiting their turn to enter the institution, as the war and the flu epidemic have crowded the present quarters to such an extent that there is no room at present for them, but it is hoped that accommodations will soon be arranged.

Twenty-seven vocations are taught at Mooseheart at present, including farming, dairying, horticulture, stock raising, mechanical engineering, civil engineering, cement work, journalism, printing, carpentering, painting, decorating, and others.

Judge Joy mentioned two little children who were on the ill-fated Titanic, when it struck an ice berg and who were saved by Colonel John Jacob Astor giving up his seat to them and their mother, sacrificing his own life by doing so. The father and husband who was a member of the order, when he received the news that the Titanic had been wrecked was so overcome with grief that he became mentally unbalanced and never recovered, dying soon after the wreck occurred.

Judge Joy laid particular stress on the cleanliness of the children and the superb sanitary conditions surrounding their lives there.

Owing to conditions over which no one seemed to have control, the dinner was not up to the usual standard given by the Salvation Army and for this Captain and Mrs. Purdy wish to apologize and promise the public that the next dinner will have better service and be a better dinner. They also wish to thank the many people contributing in any way to the effort and to say to those who contributed something and it was not called for, that it was because of lack of time.

The total amount taken in on Saturday from the dinner, serving in the evening, and the sale, amounted to \$318.30. After the expense is met, the balance will be used for winter relief work.
