From the fire department, no calls.

From the police department, 12 arrests, two state prisoners, one drunkenness, one disorderly conduct, seven traffic violation, one juvenile delinquent. Fines collected \$50.

The street force was employed in removing leaves from the streets and making repairs of streets and crosswalks.

One new tap was made for water service at 1911 Washington ave., and some repair of leaks in the mains. Aside from this there was no special work in the water department. The meter reading for the month was done as usual and a number of turn-ons and turn-offs made. Practically all of the service for sprinkling and irrigating has now been discontinued and these taps shut off for the winter.

A break in the large main on Greenwood street during the night of October 26th allowed considerable water to escape before notice of same reached the water office and the mains could be shut off. The break was caused by the spreading part of a joint at Greenwood and Monroe avenue. This has been repaired and the service restored as before. Some inconvenience was caused to water users in the east portion of the city but this could not be avoided under the circumstances, of course. The new Beaver creek intake dam has been completed, pipe laid to same and the water turned in at that point. The intake is now some 370 feet up the stream than it was before and the water should be about four feet above the pipe when the dam has filled. The present intake is also some 21 feet higher than the former one.
