**The Home Loan Movement Is Needed.**

"The home starvation of the nation cannot safely depend upon casual financing for alleviation," says K. V. Haymaker, of the Department of Labor, in Civic Comment. Mortgage loans seem to be the only way of financing the widespread housing program, which is imperative if anything like the necessary number of homes is to be built in the next few years. The system of building and loan associations, which is all there is to depend on for this financing at present, shows one inherent difficulty, says Mr. Haymaker. "When applications for loans exceed their ordinary resources, there is no practical plan by which their mortgage assets can be utilized as a basis for credit with which to obtain additional funds for which a new Just when money is most needed, it runs out."

The Calder home-loan bill is an attempt to remedy this defect. It would authorize building associations to co-operate in organizing, capitalizing and operating, under careful federal supervision, a system of regional banks which will provide these associations with a service similar to that rendered by the Federal Reserve System to the commercial banks of the country, and somewhat parallel to the existing Farm Loan System.

"The loan association can then deposit mortgages as security; the bank will issue bonds up to 80 per cent of the value of the mortgages, turning the proceeds over to the association. The association repays the money in small semi-annual payments. The federal government thus assists in home-building without the issuance of a cent of federal funds in loans, acting only to make liquid the assets now held as fixed capital."

The plan on which the bill is based sounds reasonable. In any case, it is evident that home-building deserves some kind of federal assistance quite as much as farm-improving does. Nothing so advances the self-respect and power of a family as the ownership of a home. Any measure furthering the building and owning of homes deserves careful attention.
