POSSIBILITIES FOR THRIFT AND SAVING

Possibilities for thrift and saving among the housewives was thoroughly demonstrated recently at the State Fair held at Raleigh, N. C., through the co-operative extension work in Agriculture and Home Economics organized by the state in conjunction with the federal department of Agriculture and the State College of Agriculture and Engineering.

Under direction of Mrs. Jane S. McKimmon, State Home Demonstration Agent, various methods of saving material, time, labor and money was thoroughly explained. The Home Dress-making booth showed methods of remodeling garments and the results obtained in turning old suits and dresses into attractive garments.

The Millinery Booth showed the possibility of every woman becoming her own milliner with demonstrations of producing simple hats at a cost of from 50 cents to \$1 each. It is claimed that a goodly portion of the women of North Carolina now are wearing attractive home-made hats as a result of teaching along this line.

The Convenient Kitchen Booth had dress on thrift in many ways of saving time and material by use of fireless and steam pressure cooking and in preparing garden, dairy and poultry products for commercial consumption.

The work of the state demonstration agents, 42 of whom carried on the work at the fair, is being done in conjunction with the campaign of the War Savings Division of the Treasury Department to "Work and Save" and for investment of savings in War certificates and other governmental securities.

Included in the list is the bill, recently passed, providing vocational training for the industrially disabled and the Nolan minimum wage bill. Senator Kenyon is pushing legislation to provide for the Americanization of alien-born laborers, through education, which he believes is the remedy for much of the present industrial

down being made, the general level of retail prices. In October 1 was about 120 percent above pre-war figures, or an increase of five percent as compared with the level of September 1 last when the local tribunals were just getting under way. But it is not contended, even by these fault-finders, that the increase would not have been larger had the government made no effort to bring the profiteers to book.

Altogether such objections may be set such testimonials as that of the Vermont Profiteering Committee which claims that a reduction in wholesale prices by as much as thirty-five percent has been noticeable in that locality.

Membership of the local tribunals is fixed at from seven to twenty-five, two of whom must be women. All complaints are heard in public except in special cases when under authority of the Board of Trade, proceedings may be in private. Books or diaries produced at private hearings are to be treated as confidential if the person producing them so desires. Under representation of the local tribunals and on the Central committee, among the members of the committee being J. H. Thomas, executive head of railway men during the recent strike and G. H. Small, manager, president of the British Trade Union Congress.

All charges investigated. Local tribunals have been empowered to investigate all claims brought before them and if the allegations of excessive charges are established, to institute proceedings against the seller before a court of summary jurisdiction where, upon conviction, fines of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for three months or both may be imposed.

Questions before local tribunals are decided by a majority of the members present and voting. Any seller notified by any finding of a local tribunal, other than a decision to take proceedings before a court of summary jurisdiction, may appeal to the Appeal Tribunal for the area in which the local tribunal is operating. The institution of court proceedings is not the only function of the local tribunals. They may, at the request of interested parties, declare the price which would yield a reasonable profit on the article in question, or require the seller to pay to the complainant any amount paid by him in excess of this stipulated price.

Includes Many Humorous Cases

Local tribunals all over England have lists of complaints for investigation. The articles range from handkerchiefs at 20 cents a pair to handkerchiefs of quality five cents a pair. From unadorned sugar pans at \$1.45 to spotted cotton at fourteen cents. A Westchester committee has been called on to investigate a charge of \$125 for a woman's hat, another of \$35 for a coat and skirt and a

charge of eight cents for a breakfast roll.

A complaint was made before the Walton-On-Thames committee of a lamp shade which it was alleged, could be purchased a few miles distant for thirty-two cents.

At Bangor a man complained that he had been charged sixty-five cents for tea for himself and a friend. The committee ordered a refund of sixteen cents.

Wholesales are Checked.

Efforts instituted among retail dealers to check profiteering "high-ups"—among the wholesalers—has been of much assistance to the Central Committee in its investigation of twelve or more suspected price "combines" including dealers in boots and shoes, rubber clothing, hosiery, blankets, ready-made clothing, soap, tobacco and medicines.

Location of price "combines" has not been uncommon although it has been a general question in those maximum times in which cases of such a kind with a threat of prosecution should there be a second reaction.
