POET—WARRIOR MONEY COULDN'T BUY GOOD IT DID

SEIZURE OF FUME CONSIDERED ULTIMATUM TO WORLD.

Exploits of D'Annunzio Save Days Subject of Many Writers in England.

LONDON, Nov. 19.—Gabriele D'Annunzio's seizure of Fiume and issuance of an ultimatum of defiance to the world—has brought out many stories in England concerning the alleged eccentricities of the Italian poet-warrior. Among these are the following published by John O'London's Weekly.

"If the artistic temperament is the half-mark of the self-conscious showman, D'Annunzio has it to a premeditated degree. It manifests itself in many ways. He is the possessor, for instance, of a wardrobe which might make a Brummell envious.

"Like the elder Dumas, he is a rapid worker. On one occasion he completed a play containing 3,000 verses in seventeen days. He finds that he works best at night, and his usual procedure is to start after dinner, at about eight o'clock, and write on steadily until nine the following morning. Then, after a light breakfast, he retires to bed—for the remainder of the day.

"A fondness for strange pets is one of his characteristics. Some years ago he tamed a small batman, and kept it three years. On its death D'Annunzio buried it in a large mantlepiece of the poet's study. The opening of the rafter is closed by a black marble slab, upon which in letters of gold are inscribed the words, 'Beatrice salamandrae sacrum.'

"At one time he kept over forty strange of his pets, however, is a goldfish, on which he has bestowed the name of Lou-Pe-Li-Tel. Of this curious inmate of his household D'Annunzio has declared that 'it possesses the two qualities most rare in life—it is clean and silent.'

"The subject of death looms large in all his writings, and he has already built a tomb for himself among the Apennines, not far from the source of the river Pescara, to which so many references are made in his works."

EUGENE, Nov. 19.—Over 30 tons of old papers were gathered by the pupils of the Eugene schools during the past week, and they will be sold, the proceeds to be applied to the purchase of pictures, playground apparatus and other things needed at the various schools.
