MC'NARY ON WAY HOME TO REST

LEFT WASHINGTON SATURDAY FOR OREGON.

Will Rest Few Days Before Returning to Next Session of Congress.
WASHINGTON, Nov. 24.—Senator McNary is on his way home to spend a few days before returning to his duties in the next session of congress.

"I am leaving for my home in Oregon for rest and relaxation," he said Saturday before starting across the continent. "I am very tired and feel the need of a change." When asked about the Peace Treaty Senator McNary made the following statement:

"I do not think it is the wish of the senate to kill the treaty of peace. This desire resides only in the mind of a few of the senators, not more than 15 of the entire membership of 36.

"The eventual fate of the treaty rests largely with the president. If he desires the covenant of the league of nations accepted without reservations, the senate as composed today will disappoint him. If he will accept reservations similar to those offered by the majority of the senate, though in part modified, the treaty will be ratified. If agreement is reached early in December among the friends of the treaty it can be ratified during that month.

"This by all means should be done, congress should be relieved of the presence of the treaty including the covenant of the League of Nations, so that it can proceed to deal with railroads, strikes, merchant marine and other pressing questions.

"I have no doubt that the treaty would have been ratified during the day that congress adjourned, had it not been for the president's letter to the Democratic members of the senate, wherein he declared that the acceptance of the resolutions of ratification would result in nullification rather than ratification of the treaty. This letter had the effect of withholding from the support of the resolution a sufficient number of democrats to defeat the treaty.

"I hope that the treaty will be ratified during the first days of the next session of congress, which convenes December 1. I should like to see the experiment of the League of Nations tried and have faith that eventually it will prove a great preventive of war."
