ATTENDS STATE WATER BOARD
 RIGHTS OF MALHEUR RIVER WERE ENTERED.
 Large Irrigation Project Initiated to Irrigate About 20,000 Acres Near Vale.

State Water Superintendent Geo. T. Cochran today arrived home from Salem, where he attended a meeting of the state water board. At this meeting, the findings of the water board upon the Malheur River water rights were entered.

The record of the Malheur river is one of the largest records concerning water rights in the state of Oregon. Claims were filed before Superintendent Cochran, testimony was taken, and the whole record made about forty volumes.

Upon the Malheur river, a large irrigation project has been initiated, and the Warm Spring Irrigation District organized for the purpose of irrigating about thirty thousand acres in and around Vale. Prior to the organization of the district, there were between fifty and sixty thousand acres of land irrigated from the Malheur river and its tributaries, and the decision became extremely important when the irrigation district was organized, so as to aggregate the water rights of the other users from the water rights of the district.

The initiative law provides that to submit a measure to the voters by the initiative it is necessary to obtain the signatures of 2,000 voters of the 1920 voters of the state. The petitions and the measure submitted to the voters (here it is also stated) less than ten months prior to the date of the general election.

The death penalty for convicted murderers in the state of Oregon was removed by a vote of the people on November 3, 1914. The suggestion of the abolishment act was by a narrow margin of but 157 votes. The campaign in favor of the removal of the death penalty was carried on by a league known as the Anti-Capital Punishment League.

Former Governor Oswald West, was one of the prime movers in this league and gave much aid to the campaign to remove the death penalty.
