KELSEY MAKES WATER REPORT

GIVEN WRITTEN REPORT ON PERMANENT SUPPLY.

Is Made Orally to Commissioners. Meeting. Age—Three. Qualities Explained.

November 12, 1919. Mr. John C. Kelsey, La Grande, Ore. In the matter of a permanent water supply for the city of La Grande, La Grande, Ore. has submitted the following preliminary report:

Location: Glass River. The Looking Glass River is a mountain stream of pure water with a volume sufficient for an adequate supply to a city of 9,000 inhabitants.

It is of sufficient elevation to flow into the city's reservoir by a gravity waterworks system.

Its only objection is the great distance from the city and the resultant high cost of bringing it in. The approximate cost of installing a gravity system using this source of supply will be from \$200,000 to \$300,000. The city of La Grande will afford the expenditure. This will make an ideal water supply, caring for future demands, and furnishing water of most excellent quality.

Lower Beaver Creek. The measurements at Lower Beaver Creek show a flow of 2,500,000 gallons per day in addition to about 1,500,000 gallons per day entering the Beaver Creek Pipe Line, making a total available minimum supply of 4,000,000 gallons per day from this source. The maximum requirements of the city of La Grande is 2,700,000 gallons per day. Any additional requirements of the city will have to be cared for by some other source. The question of water rights in connection with this installation will have to be considered.

The approximate cost of this installation will be about \$250,000. Present Beaver Creek Pipe Line.

The total available minimum supply of the present Beaver Creek pipe line is only about 1,500,000 gallons per day, without storage. This can be made available by bringing in the Beaver Creek line and taking Beaver Creek around the present storage reservoir.

As between the present Beaver Creek supply and the Lower Beaver Creek supply, the latter is much the more feasible proposition.

Any proposition of buying a permanent water supply for the city of La Grande on the reconstruction of the Beaver Creek pipe line is not justified.

These estimates are only approximate and are not based on actual surveys.
