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ARCHIVES BUILDING NEEDED

The establishment of a national archives building in Washington, D. C., is a project which has been discussed for many years. The need for such a building is becoming increasingly apparent as the volume of government records continues to grow.

The accumulation of such papers should be preserved for historical reference purposes of the inevitable result of years of government. It was a thing which could be done in a true proportion and for which adequate provision has been made.

This is the result in care and hazardous methods of storage which are being used for the records. Until they are properly arranged in buildings definitely calculated to withstand fire, theft and the deterioration of time so far as may be, they will be subject to destruction and difficult of access.

It is stated that the business of copying and re-assembling the papers which are the material out of the recent fire will cost \$2,000,000.
