LA GRANDE MAY WELL BOAST

O. A. C. GRADUATES BUILD UP PINE DEPARTMENT.

Entire New Floor Is Now Being Equipped for Home Economics Department in High School

CORVALLIS, Feb. 8.—"La Grande may rightfully boast of one of the most attractive and best arranged public school home economics departments in the state," says Miss Hazel Magnuson, a graduate of O. A. C. class of 1919, in a letter to Miss Bertha Davis, district supervisor of home economics.

Miss Magnuson is head of the home economics department of the La Grande public schools and has succeeded in building up a department that has outgrown its original quarters. She has been assisted by Miss Marjorie Barratt, also a graduate of O. A. C. class of 1919, who is instructor in household arts.

Interest in this department developed to such an extent that the board of education decided to furnish new and larger quarters. The space was provided by raising the roof of the new manual training building and adding another story. The entire new floor is being equipped for home economics work and it is expected that classes will meet there at the beginning of the second semester, according to Miss Magnuson.

The new department includes a fully equipped domestic science laboratory composed of three unit kitchens, a cafeteria, laundry, dining-room, and reception room. The household arts unit has a large sewing laboratory, fitting room, closets, exhibit cabinets, and a teacher's rest room.

CHARLES BECK WINS WRESTLING BOUT AT ELGIN

ELGIN, Feb. 8.—Charles Beck, who was defeated in Baker recently in a wrestling match by O. D. Scott, Baker champion, won in two falls

over Nelson, of Elgin, Saturday. Beck won the first fall in 20 minutes with an arm scissor; the second fall went to Nelson in three minutes, with a toe hold. Beck came back for the third fall, winning in 11 minutes, with a toe hold.

It is understood that Scott, the Baker champion, is to have a return match with Beck, to be staged at Halsey in the near future.

R. N. STANFIELD IS READY TO LEAVE FOR WASHINGTON

PORTLAND, Feb. 8.—United States Senator-Elect Robert N. Stanfield is now in Portland from his home in Eastern Oregon, placing his business affairs in shape preparatory to leaving for Washington, D. C. Senator Stanfield intends to be in Washington to be sworn in by March 4. Stanfield is taking a deep interest in the proposal to eliminate Panama canal tolls on American coast-to-coast ships, believing that the elimination would reduce ocean freight rates and be a boon to the Northwest.
