CRIME WAVE IS LIKE THE TIDES

VOLUME OF MURDERS SWEEPS
OVER KANSAS CITY.

Crime in Middle West City, Is a Highly
Organized Business Which Public
Is Unable to Combat.

KANSAS CITY, Feb. 11.—With the regularity of the tides, rather than an occasional wave, crime has surged over Kansas City in a vast volume of murders, robberies and lesser acts of criminality during the last few months according to Ward Gifford, executive secretary of the Law Enforcement Association, formed here for the purpose, not only of suppressing crime, but to ascertain and correct conditions which foster it.

Crime in Kansas City is a highly organized business and those who are directing crime use as efficient methods as any successful person does in conducting a legitimate enterprise," Mr. Gifford declared. "The public cannot hope to combat organized crime without organized opposition."

Mr. Gifford declared that it was because criminals found refuge and entertainment in Kansas City that they made their operations a continuous performance here. With this in mind, the Law Enforcement Association plans a censorship of motion picture theaters, pool and dance halls, gambling and the social evil. To root out crime, he said, the city must be cleaned up morally. Unemployment, he said, was not considered to be a factor in law-breaking as yet. He pointed out that practically all of the robberies were committed by youths of from 17 to 25 years of age, a period which he explained, sociologists considered as the most dangerous for the development of criminal tendencies.

The Law Enforcement Association, made up of 600 citizens, he said, is a sort of modernization of the old time Vigilance Committee, only that it works entirely in co-operation with the authorities. An outline of its purposes includes advocacy of more stringent criminal laws; following up of arrests and seeing that the law-breakers are prosecuted; advising with officials on pardons and paroles and keeping a corps of investigators constantly at work collecting data on moral irregularities.

While the association is comparatively young, Mr. Gifford pointed out that automobile thefts have been reduced fifty per cent. A number of rewards also have been paid for the capture of criminals, including \$2,500 for the taking of Denzel Chester, charged with the murder of Miss Florence Barton, a young society girl here last October. It was the sensation caused by Miss Barton's death which resulted in the formation of the Enforcement Association.

Mr. Gifford admitted, however, that the association had most of its work ahead of it—that the curve in the crime scale still showed a menacing upward trend.

PORTLAND IS TO BE HOST

WILL ENTERTAIN INTERNATIONAL
MINING CONVENTION.

Delegates and Their Families Will Be
Highly Entertained On
April 5-9.

PORTLAND, Feb. 11.—(Special.)—Portland is preparing to be host to the third annual international mining convention to be held here April 5-9. Fifteen hundred delegates, exclusive of their families, will attend and will represent a territory covering Alaska, British Columbia, and the six states of Montana, Idaho, Washington, Oregon, California, and Nevada. Everything pertaining to mines and mining will be discussed, and every mechanical equipment used in mining and every ore and mineral taken from the territory embraced will be exhibited.

The delegates and their families will be the special guests of business men and social leaders of Portland, and every attention will be given to their comfort and entertainment. A special committee comprised of the city's most prominent women has been appointed to look after the wives of the delegates. Banquets, dances and automobile rides to scenic spots will be liberally sprinkled through the five days' session.

Among the distinguished men who have been invited to address the convention on subjects pertaining to mines and mining are: Herbert Hoover, Governor Riggs of Alaska, the Honorable William Sloan, minister of Mines for British Columbia; Edwin Ludlow, of New York, who succeeds Mr. Hoover as president of the American Institute of Mining and Metallurgical Engineers; and W. J. Loring, of Los Angeles, president of the American Mining Congress.
