

DENNIS AND ELLIS WOULD DEFER ACTION UNTIL 1921

RESOLUTION IS INTRODUCED INTO SENATE ASKING FOR APPOINTMENT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE TO MAKE TWO YEAR INVESTIGATION

Two Senators, Two Representatives and the Governor Would Be Appointed On Committee, Which Would Make Thorough Investigation Into the Matter of Lake Bottoms During the Coming Two Years.

SALEM, Feb. 22.—Having an important bearing on the debate on the Bennett lake bottom bill, was a concurrent resolution introduced early today by Senators Dennis and Ellis, providing that a committee of five, to be composed of two senators, two representatives and the governor, be appointed to investigate the question for the next two years, and report at the session of 1923. There was confusion, however, as to the intent of the resolution. Senator Ellis, who represents the Malheur county people, in his speech indicated that the resolution and the bill together, would afford protection to the settlers, and although he said he had been doubtful of the justice of the bill with respect to the settlers, he would vote for it because of the resolution.

Senator Dennis pleaded for the settlers who early settled on the shores of Malheur Lake and made the country. He took a flat stand on the resolution and urged that action be deferred two years.

Senator Eberhard declared Senator Ellis, the senator whose constituents are the Malheur settlers, had switched and that he would switch with him, explaining with the assertion, that Ellis should know what his people want.

Union county will only have approximately half the amount of money provided by taxation last year. The tax for next year for road work unless a portion of the unpaid but authorized road bonds are sold this year. The tax money for road work from the one mill levy will be increased this

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The budget for last year included an additional \$15,000 for roads and a like amount for bridges. No provision whatever is made in the general budget for these additional funds.

the amount of money available from taxation for road and bridge work to \$55,938.93. In addition, \$60,000 in bonds were sold last year, increasing the money spent for roads to \$115,938.93.

The balance of the unsold but authorized bonds (issuable amounts to \$1,100,000, of which a maximum of \$400,000 can be sold in one year.

Judge D. G. Cochran, of the county court, in discussing road matters yesterday afternoon, stated that it is possible that the \$450,000 bonds that can be sold annually under the pro-

visions of the new bonding acts will be sold this year and instead of a very unsatisfactory road program, considerable work will be done if these bonds are sold.
