FARMERS SEEK FEDERAL LOANS

SUPREME COURT DECISION EXPECTED TO CAUSE LOANS.

Local Farm Loan Association's Business Will Be Increased—Much Relief Is Expected.

The announcement yesterday that the supreme court had decided in favor of the constitutionality of the federal farm loan act has resulted in a demand for applications for such loans, according to Chas. H. Reynolds, manager of the Grande Ronde National Farm Loan Association, which is affiliated with the federal land bank at Spokane.

Big Loans Here.
Mr. Reynolds stated this afternoon that he expected the number of loans in this district to increase materially. At present there is \$381,500 in loans from the government outstanding here. The local association has 81 members.

In commenting on the general effect of the decision of the supreme court, Mr. Reynolds stated that he believed there will be no sudden and entire relief from the scarcity of money but opening of this channel of relief to the farmers, its going to do its bit to help relieve conditions in general.

New Applications.
Farmers who had applications for loans on file 18 months ago when the associations were stopped from doing business because of a court decision, will have to file applications again, as the time elapsed has been so great.

Under the farm loan act the government loans money at from one to 22 years, payable in small yearly installments and charges the farmer only 5 1/2 percent interest, considerably under the usual loan rate. The farmer gives a first mortgage as security. The maximum amount of a loan securable under this act is half of the appraised value of the land.

state committees of Oregon report receipts by the Republican of \$8,205.24 and the Democrats of \$12,633.28. In both cases some of this money was used in local campaigns.

In addition, the Republican senatorial committee sent to Oregon \$15,450.

Two states received more, Arizona \$23,000 and Nevada \$17,000.

The sum of \$375,979 was expended by the Republican congressional committee.
