secretary of war, and Senator Fall, to be secretary of the interior.

Most of them will not actually take over the direction of their departments until Saturday. Meantime, some are conferring with present cabinet officers.

The influx of visitors to attend the inauguration has started. Hundreds of persons have arrived and the number is expected to run into the thousands. The forecast of cold and probably fair weather for that day, announced today, may increase the out-of-town crowd.

Whether President Wilson is actually to attend the inauguration of Mr. Harding still remains to be determined. White House officials said that the president was eager to follow all precedents and the congressional in-
