TRACK SQUAD IS PROMISING

EARL REYNOLDS APPOINTED COACH FOR LOCAL TEAM.

First Practice of Year Shows Material of Much Promise—Coach is Experienced Track Man.

Earl Reynolds was appointed coach for the La Grande high school track team this year. Reynolds should be able to turn out another winning team if experience counts along that line. He is a four-year track man from O. A. C. and knows a lot of the little wrinkles that often mean a lot in training a bunch of high school lads who haven't had a great deal of experience in nosing an opponent out by a fraction of a second in a race.

Reynolds was appointed coach at the meeting of the board of education Wednesday night and Thursday issued his first call for men, and a crew of men turned out after school that night. It's too early in the season to make much of a guess as to who will be among the leaders this season, but there is a lot of promising material among those turning out Thursday night, Reynolds says both old members of the team and new men being among the bunch. The basketball season is not over yet so something in track and field events this spring will not be out for a few days yet.

Among the old track men reporting again this year are Bud Thieson, who is captain of this year's team, Ben, Waldo Stoddard, Blockland and Sandberg. Christian will be out as soon as the basketball season is over, Ted and Tige Larson are among the other promising lads who worked out yesterday.
