SHE TOLD OF PHILIPPINES

MISS DWYER DELIVERS MOST INTERESTING LECTURE.

Lecturer and Mrs. George T. Cochran Were Friends in the Islands. Some Years Ago.

Showing remarkable pictures of the Philippine Islands, depicting the customs of the people, the industry of the Orient, the great opportunities awaiting capital, Miss E. A. Dwyer, an accomplished speaker with story of the insular possessions that should have been heard by every citizen, entertained a number of La Grande people this afternoon at the Star theatre.

Miss Dwyer is a personal friend of Mrs. George T. Cochran, the ladies having been friends while Mrs. Cochran was in the Islands. She served with the government in the Philippines and is deeply interested in the islands and in "our little brown brothers" across the sea.

When asked why more natives did not come to the United States, Miss Dwyer explained that there are but ten million people in the islands, whereas they have a country that will support eighty millions.

"Do you realize," reminded the lady, with enthusiasm, "showing her love for the Orient, that there are vast tracts of most valuable land there with the soil unbroken? It is a most marvelous country, with its wealth of natural resources. When I hear people in this good nation of ours remark that the day of the men pushing forth and getting land for himself by way of improvement and habitation, I marvel at such a remark when I realize the great expanse of country in the Philippines that awaits American workers."

Miss Dwyer is here upon request of the government to show the pictures and tell the story of the Philippine Islands so that Americans may better understand what a country lies across the Pacific and floats the stars and stripes.

Primitive Lamps.

The first lamps, known as "Berry" lamps, introduced in America, when the first Pilgrims landed, resembled somewhat the old Greek models. Some were forged from iron, and others were cast in brass. They were flat on top and bottom, and the wick supported by a crude bar, fastened by the lower end to the inside bottom of the lamp. A handle at the back attached by links to a pointed hook, held the lamp suspended from a high backed chair or crevice in the stone fireplace.

The will of the late James Melroy was declared null and void and set aside late Monday afternoon. The ground for the action was that the deceased was not of testamentary capacity at the time of making the will. The amount of the estate involved is about \$12,000.

OFFICIALS GO TO PORTLAND ON ROAD BUSINESS

Judge U. G. Couch, J. F. Hutchinson, of Union, county commissioner and Frank Birney, county roadmaster, left last evening for Portland, where they will meet with the state highway commission today to discuss the road program for Union county this spring. They will also confer with the public service commission regarding the proposed overhead crossing at Union, on

which a hearing was held here recently, the meeting with the commission this week being a continuation of the previous meeting to finish the taking of evidence on the matter.

Judge Couch stated yesterday before leaving for Portland, that considerable road work would be put under way in the county after April 1. He is not able to state definitely the amount of work to be done at this time, but in all probability will be able to give an estimate on his return from Portland.

FAST GAME ON TOMORROW

PERRY LUMBERJACKS ARE TO MEET HALL ROOM BOYS.

Perryites Only Ones Able to Down Hall Room Boys This Season and Game Should Be a Stunner.

The big basketball game of the evening tomorrow will be that between the Hall Room Boys and the Lumberjacks of the city league. The Hall Room lads have lost only to the Lumberjacks, who hail from the town of Perry, out beyond the limits of the city of La Grande; none of the teams in the league from the city proper being able to conquer them. Added zest will be seen in the game tomorrow in that the captain of the local lads, H. H. Englebrecht, is back and will do his share to make the game the fastest ever played on the local floor, as well as seeing that all of his men are on their toes every second during the game. Whoever way the score goes, there is no doubt that the game will be a fast one. This game is to be called at 9 o'clock, following the three minor games.

At 8:15 a game is to be played between the boys from the Presbyterian church and the lads from the Catholic church. Max Cullis is captain of the former and Bob Garrity of the latter.

In the intermediate basketball league, two games will be played. The first will be between the Oliver and the Cullis and will start at 7. While the second will be between the Fards and Cokers and will start at 7:30.

Accurate Balances.

The British mint contains some wonderfully accurate and sensitive balances. In one of the rooms there are two large pair of scales kept in glass cases, suspended on pulleys. The pair used for weighing out silver will record the weight of a postage stamp, but even more sensitive is the balance one used for gold. It will show the difference in weight between two absolutely identical pieces of paper, one of which contains a signature and the other does not.
