New York life to the very core is the essence of the famous Fox melodrama, "While New York Sleeps," which begins its run Thursday at the Arcade.

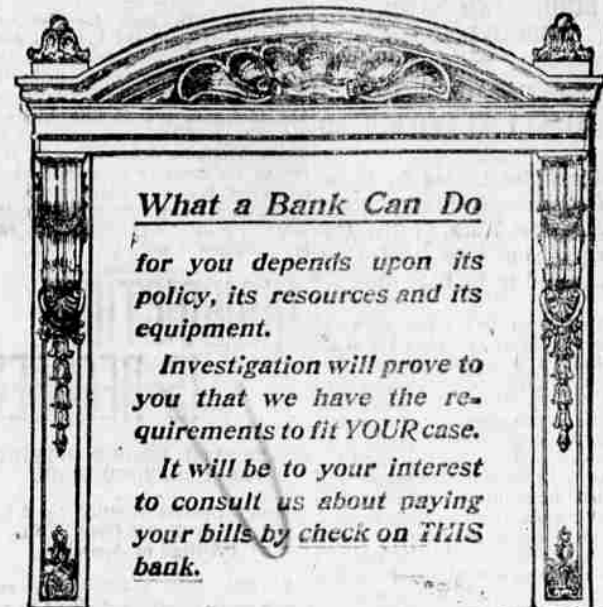
