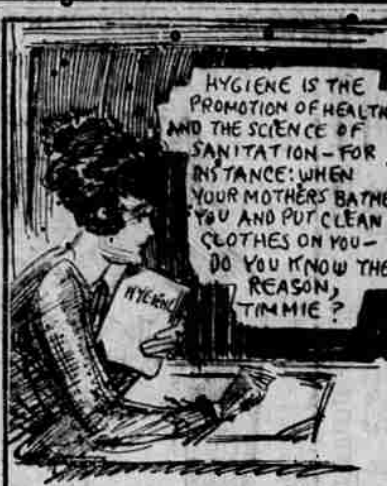

BUILDING WILL START SHORTLY

FRED SPAETH SEES ICE BROKEN AND CONSTRUCTION TO START.

Plans Long Contemplated Will Be Put Into Action During the Coming Season.

"The ice is broken and the building game will be on this summer," remarked Fred Spaeth, one of La Grande's best known plumbers to the Observer.

"The plans that have long been drawn for many homes and other buildings will come out this year, or at least a portion of them will, and before autumn we will witness a partial solution of the housing problem which has been so perplexing to every community. In the zone in which I operate, which is between Boise and Walla Walla, there is a great deal of construction ready to start. I have plans in my office for many thousand dollars worth of plumbing that I am now figuring and I have perfect confidence in much of the work being pushed to completion this year."

Mr. Spaeth is very active in his line of work and has installed plumbing in some of the largest jobs erected in the inland Empire. Last year he did over one hundred thousand dollars worth of business. La Grande is his headquarters, but, besides operating here all the time, he is constantly busy with work in other cities.

WOULD CURE LEPROSY

Propagation of Plants for the Production of Oil to be Undertaken.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 11.—Propagation of plants for production of vegetable oils used in the fight against leprosy has been undertaken by the department of agriculture. Seeds of the Hydrocarpus anthelmintica tree, forwarded from Bangkok, Siam, by Dr. J. F. Rock, of the University of Hawaii, will be sent to Florida, Porto Rico and Hawaii for the purpose.

Recent progress in the anti-leprosy crusade through use of chaulmoogra oil, obtained from a tree grown in Burma, prompted the new effort. Experts of the department, working since 1914, have succeeded in producing a similar oil from seeds of three other trees including the variety received from Bangkok and hope to supply the doctors with an additional weapon in their fight against the disease.
