HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS WIN

CITY LEAGUE BASKETBALL SEASON ENDS.

Fastest Game Ever Played in La Grande Gives Decisive Victory To High School Lads.

The end of the basketball season in La Grande came yesterday evening when the High School Seniors defeated the Hall Room Boys, winning the city league championship. The game was declared to be the fastest game ever played in La Grande.

Until last evening the High School Seniors and the Hall Room Boys had both maintained a clean record of no games lost, each having won six games. The odds seemed to favor the Hall Room Boys but the high school lads bucked up and gave them such a fight that the former were defeated by a score of 22 to 13.

From start to finish the winners had the edge on their opponents, so far as the score was concerned, but the fight was so intense that it was an endurance contest and, up to the last five minutes of play, it would have been entirely probable that the team with the small end of the score could come back and make it hot for the leaders.

At the end of the first half the

score stood 9 to 5 and the second half added 13 points to the score of the High School Seniors, while the Hall Room Boys annexed 8 points.

Black, for the seniors, made five field goals and one foul basket. Christian made three field baskets and Theison two. The line-up of the team was as follows: Black and Christian, forwards; Lynch, center; Theison and Chandler, guards.

Proctor made two baskets from the field for the Hall Room lads and Snow made three. Brandt made the other field goal, while Englebrecht made a goal from the foul line.

The line-up of the losing team was as follows: Proctor and Brandt, forwards; Englebrecht, center; Lindley and Snow, guards.

Following the final game in the city league series, A. Edwin Pryke, physical director of the Y. M. C. A., who had charge of the city league teams, announced the selection of an all-star team. The team is composed of the following: Forwards—Frank Black, of the High School Seniors; G. Ballantyne, of the Lumberjacks; center—H. H. Englebrecht, of the Hall Room Boys; guards—C. C. Snow, of the Hall Room Boys, and Lester Stoddard, of Stoddard Bros.; substitute forward—Wright Christian, of the High School Seniors; substitute guard—Chester Lindley, of the Hall Room Boys.

At last night's game, Chas. Reynolds was referee, Forrest Scroggins, timekeeper, and Harvey Larsen, scorer.

In the first game between the Lumberjacks and the Purity Squad, the former won by a score of 20 to 11.

At the end of the first half the score stood 12 to 7. Stoddard made three field goals for the Lumberjacks and Ballantyne made three field goals and two foul goals, while Robertson made one field goal and Smith made two.

Stoddard and Ballantyne were forwards and Robertson, center; Murray and Smith were guards.

For the Purity Squad, Taylor made two goals, Lyman two, and Metcalf one, while Lyman also made a point on a foul. Taylor and Geddes played forward, Lyman center, and Johnson and Ash guards. Metcalf substituted.
