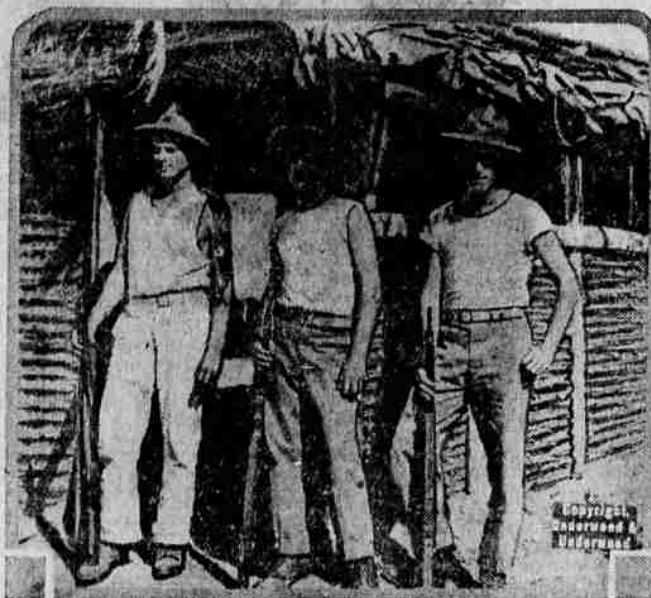

The authorship of "Yankee Doodle" is generally ascribed to Dr. Richard Shuckburg, a British surgeon and wit. Dr. Edward Everett Hale has attributed the present version of "Yankee Doodle" to Edward Harvard Bangs, who graduated from Harvard in 1777. The tune has been attributed to various countries and even carried back to the church of the middle ages, but most likely it had its origin in England. It is found in an opera by Samuel Arnold, "Two to One," produced in London in 1784.
